WHAT CAPITALISM DOES.

Enables the Few to Take the Cream of the Products of Labor. Socialism denies with all its vigor the monstrous contention of the capitalist class that the farmer who toils laboriously to feed a hungry world should be content with a few old clothes and enough food to keep life in his body; that the wageworker who toils day in, day out, with hand and brain in a whizzing factory to fashion into merchantable shapes these raw products from field, forest and mine shall be given only a rented house and a "dinner pail" for his toil, and it therefore brands as the very quintessence of injustice an industrial system that condemns to lifelong toil for a bare living these most useful members of human society—the farmer and the wageworker—while it gives to the man who only sits in skyscrapers and schemes the very cream of what the working class has produced. Yet that is what the private ownership of capital and the competitive system of industry are doing, and they are doing it because the wealth producers whom they are despoiling are using the capitalist class the power to do so. This may be news to the "indifferent" wageworker or farmer, who never voted the ticket of any party that did not claim to be the "friend of labor" but it is true nevertheless.—Lila L. Benson.

The "Independent" Farmer. Mr. Joe, if the trusts were not making more money off the farmers than they could make by owing the farms and running them with hired labor (do you think they would soon own farms? To be sure! Farmers are "bait" for the trusts that the hired man are. It is less trouble and more money for organized capital to control the organized farmer by controlling the means of transportation and his markets than it would be at present to own the farms and have to deal with the wageworkers. So much for the "independence" of the noble farmer! And, again, money is largely loaned on farm mortgages at 5 or 6 per cent per year, or about 4 per cent net. If the capitalist money lender could make more than the usual rate of interest by running the farms with hired labor wouldn't they soon own them? Then don't you see that the "independent farmer" is more profitable to the capitalist class than the wageworker would be?—Eight Letters to a Farmer."

Investing in Revolution. In North America the capitalists finance political campaigns. In South America they finance revolutions. In both cases the undertaking is a business investment. But in South America the transaction works out somewhat differently from that in the north. The revolution succeeds, of course, and the source of profit, but if it fails, the financier is compelled to send and deliver. Here is an instance of poetic justice.—London Labor Leader.

A Sinking Ship. The old ship of capitalism is springing leaks in every part of her hold, and her rotten hull is beginning to fill, and it will not be long before the old hulk goes to the bottom. There is nothing in this to deplore. Capitalism has had its day and it has been a long one. In capitalism all the forces were generated which now make Socialism possible, and for this at least we have reason to be thankful to the old system. We had to have capitalism and pass through it before we could have Socialism. The whole productive system has been socialized within the capitalist system. It now only remains to Socialize the ownership to complete the evolution, and, this done, capitalism will end as socialism will come as inevitable as the sunset at evening and the sunrise on the morrow.—Appeal to Reaction.




