City Corruption.
 Denver is pointed out as a city most shamelessly corrupt so far as the conduct of elections by the capitalist parties is concerned. It is estimated that in the election of 1903 more fraudulent votes were cast than were ever cast anywhere else in the United States. The vested interests were imperiled and were desperate. They bought the election. A reform charter was defeated with the money, the vote brokers plying their trade almost openly. In 1904 the interests picked the Democratic candidate for governor as likely to be easiest handled and bought of the vote brokers between 7,000 and 8,000 votes, which elected their man. The reformers threatened wide exposures, and the interests got the gambling trust of that city to pay over \$11,000 to the reformers, and the exposure threats ceased. The crookedness in Denver consists in stuffing enough fraudulent ballots into the boxes to equal the fraudulent names that have been registered.—Cosmopolitan Magazine.
