GLENDIVE Baseball Season 1915

We Split With Forsyth Each Team Wins One Game

Before a crowd of nearly 500 fans—which number should have been half again as large—the Glendive team, a non-salaried aggregation of amateur ball players had the distinct honor of losing to Forsyth on Sunday at the local ball park, what was conceded to have been the fastest and cleanest ball game ever witnessed in this city within the memory of the oldest of the old-time baseball fans.

Anyone who has ever had the pleasure of seeing the all-salaried bunch of ball players from the Rosebud county seat play a full game of ball, cannot but accord the greatest credit in the world to the Glendive boys for their showing in Sunday's game and the score of 1 to 0 is convincing proof that the Gate City still has what the Monitor always claimed it has—a championship amateur ball team.

The weather was all that could be wished for, the grand stand was comfortably filled, sixty-five autos lined both sides of the field, the rooters brigade never worked harder and the enthusiasm of the spectators was constantly at fever heat. The game was a pippin from start to finish and those who failed to take the short trip across the bridge had cause aplenty to regret their lack of interest.

Umpire Howard Jones of Wibaux umpired the game like a veteran. Glendive's pitcher, Felix Fly the Sioux Indian from the Standing Rock reservation at Wakapala, South Dakota, twirled a fine game but ragged in spots, allowing six bases on balls and hitting one Forsyth batter. Sutherland for Forsyth did better, giving but one base on balls and allowing but two clean hits and two scratch bingles. The game can be said to have been won by Forsyth because of their superior hitting ability, tapping the sphere every now and then and at opportune times. Although they are credited with but six hits, they had 12 men left on bases during the game.

The Indian for Glendive got a bad start, although no runs resulted. Mensor was hit by the first ball pitched. Wolfer walked. Lamb fanned. French took the same route. Lodell walked and Peterson made the third out, Fly to Borrenson.

Forsyth's lone tally came in their lucky seventh. Crawford flew out to Broderick. Sutherland knocked a two-bagger to left center. Mensor flew out to Dyer and Sutherland took third on the throw-in. Wolfer then placed a single in center and Sutherland crossed the rubber. Lamb was out, Fly to Borrenson. One run.

Glendive's half of the first inning was one of the shortest on record. Dyer was out, French to Lodell. Foss fanned on a third strike a mile high, and Elder popped an easy foul to Brown. Time 3 1/2 minutes.

Glendive missed a dandy chance to score in the third. Cavin was out, French to Lodell. Broderick struck out on three wide ones. Borrenson walked and when Dyer hit to third and beat out the fine throw there were two men on bases. Foss fanned again, however, and the two men died.
