Hon. Paris Gibson and R. B. Smith Address a Large Audience at Sand Coulee.

HON. THOMAS H. CARTER AT THE PARK

He Spends the Evening in Explaining Why he Dodged the Silver Vote.

The German-Americans Hold an Enthusiastic Meeting at Arion Hall.

Democratic Rally at Sand Coulee. A special train was run to Sand Coulee last night bearing a number of enthusiastic democrats. On arriving at the town the party proceeded to the hall which was already filled with the people of the town. Many ladies were present. All who could, crowded into the hall and still many were compelled to stay outside. Hon. R. B. Smith addressed the people on the national issues and Carter's record. He made an able exposition of the wrongs which the McKinley bill inflicts on the poorer classes while the benefits are all in favor of the few. Mr. Smith's speech is said to have been the best made on the tariff question during the campaign. He then dissected Carter's record on silver and showed him to be a sneaking coward, unwilling to stand by the interests of the people of Montana against the capitalists of the east. Mr. Smith's speech was cheered to the echo and a number of democratic votes were made by it.

Republican Meeting.

The Park hotel was filled last night with people curious to hear Tom Carter's explanations. Many democrats were in the audience. The large number of ladies present was noticeable. Mr. Carter did not speak with the fluency and ease which characterized his address here last fall, but he seems to labor under difficulties, walking continually from end to end of the platform, gesticulating wildly and hesitating frequently. He gave the republican view of the McKinley extortion bill and tried to explain why he was not there when the test vote was made on silver and then struck the land patent question a diff. He then referred to Mr. Gibson in words of praise, stating that he was an honest man, a man of wonderful business qualifications, one who has done much for the county and town, but because he is a democrat Mr. Carter wants him defeated. 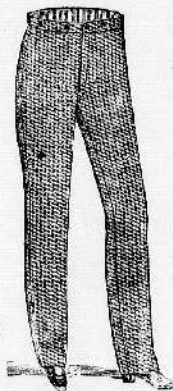
