Monument to the Maine's Dead

FOURTEEN years after the destruction of the battleship Maine in Havana harbor, and thirteen after the inception of the project to build a monument in commemoration of the 266 sailors who perished in the disaster, the cornerstone of the Maine monument was laid recently at the Columbus circle entrance to Central park, New York, facing the Coliseum monument. The monument itself will be completed in August. It will cost about \$175,000, most of which was collected by popular subscription from more than 1,000,000 men, women and children.

Rear Admiral D. H. C. Lentz, U. S. N., commander of the New York navy yard, laid the cornerstone. A metal box was sealed up in the cornerstone containing the following: Copy of Captain Charles D. Sigsbee's personal narrative of the disaster; Annual report of the chief of engineers, 1911, Appendix K, on the removal of the wreck of the battleship Maine; Hearings on the disposition of the United States battleship Maine in Havana harbor, Cuba. Message from the president of the United States transmitting the report of the naval court of inquiry upon the destruction of the United States battleship Maine in Havana harbor Feb. 15, 1898, together with testimony taken before the court. Two envelopes deposited by the architect. One envelope deposited by the contractors. Six United States coins, one of each denomination. Program of the exercises in connection with the laying of the cornerstone. History of the Maine monument. Copy of an address by General James Grant Wilson, D. C. L., upon Commodore





James Hill and the frigate Constitution delivered before the New York Society of the Order of Founders and Patriots of America, Oct. 25, 1910. Sheet containing the signatures of the committee, the sculptor and the architect. New York daily papers of Feb. 14, 1912. The monument as finally designed will include a pylon forty-four feet high, topped by a bronze group cast from the guns recovered from the sunken Maine and representing Columbia Triumphant. As this group will be thirteen feet high, the height of the monument will reach fifty-seven feet. The architect has designed also facades and a system of marble trimmings to the monument. At one side of the base of the monument there will be a group representing "Courage Awaiting the Flight of Peace" at the other will be a group representing "Justice, Having Lustrated Her Sword to the Genius of War to Execute Her Mandates, Receives It Again at His Hands, While History Records Its Deeds." The first group will bear the inscription "To the Valiant Seamen Who Perished in the Maine, by Fate Unwarranted, In Death Unafraid," the other, "To the Freemen Who Died in the War With Spain That Others Might Be Free."

NATURAL TOOTHBRUSH.

Santo Domingo Natives Don't Have to Buy the Manufactured Ones.
There is little or no demand for manufactured toothbrushes among the natives on the island of Santo Domingo. They do not see any necessity for buying them when they can gather all the toothbrushes they require along the country roads. There is a plant (Gouania domingensis) growing in certain parts of the island which is dried and powdered by the natives and used as a toothbrush. The cleansing properties have been attributed to the presence of saponin. Pieces about four inches long are cut off from the stems of the plants and dried. When about to be used they are moistened just like our own toothbrushes, and the teeth are rubbed therewith. In doing this the end of the piece gets frayed out, giving it the appearance of a toothbrush. The plant is also known and used on Jamaica Island.
