There are hundreds of barracks such as those at Camp Lewis near Tacoma, where the boys from Montana, who are joining the new national army are quartered. This picture was taken soon after the arrival of the first bunch of conscripts and shows that the camp is yet far from

being completed. In building it, more than 10,000 workmen were employed and nearly that number will be busy for some time longer giving the buildings the finishing touches and constructing additional buildings that may be required.

Thousands of conscripts from western states reach this camp daily.

When the first draft contingent is all quartered here, there will be more than 46,000 enlisted men. The officers and instructors will swell the number of men in the camp to over 50,000. This will be their home until they are trained soldiers ready to do their bit in the fight for world liberty.

## MONTANAN CASTS VOTE IN RUSSIAN REPUBLIC

In a letter received by his wife from Wilbur Catlin of Missoula, who is now in Russia, he informs her that in the election following the overthrow of the czar he cast a vote as the franchise has been granted to everybody regardless of race, color or previous position in life.

Catlin, who is a mining engineer and is following his profession in the land of Kerensky, writes that conditions in the republic are better than before the revolution. People have not yet become thoroughly

accustomed to their freedom and are taking unusual liberties.

Montana farmers are to be given a start with Burbank's super-wheat, which it is claimed, will yield from 50 to 70 bushels per acre, as 240 bushels of the new variety has been allotted to this state for seeding purposes.

E. A. Hedrick of Moore, a prominent banker and farmer, has purchased five bushels at \$5 per bushel and he expects to plant it under the most favorable conditions so that as large a yield as possible may be secured and sufficient seed obtain to plant a large acreage the second year.

## RETAIL PRICES OF COAL TO BE FIXED

COMMITTEES IN EVERY COUNTY WILL ASCERTAIN FUEL REQUIREMENTS.

Cost of Production and Distribution and Reasonable Profit Will Be Considered in Making Price of Coal to Retail Consumers; Distribution May Be Regulated.

While the railroad companies and coal mine operators in Montana are urging the importance of purchasing the winter fuel supply now and warning consumers that it will probably be impossible to produce or to transport to market the amount of coal, which will be demanded the coming winter, the federal fuel administrator, Dr. Garfield, is making arrangements to assume direction of the regulation of the sale of coal throughout the state.

It is the intention of the government to have a state representative of the federal fuel administrator named in the state, some one not connected with the coal mining industry to be chosen. The state representative is to select a committee of citizens to represent the fuel administration in each county and each city of over 2,500 population.

Situation to Be Probed. One of the first things to be done by the state committee will be to ascertain the amount of coal in the state available for use during the coming winter and the amount of coal needed to meet any deficiency, based on last year's consumption.

The various committees will be instructed to ascertain and report to the fuel administration, the reasonable retail margin, (viz., the cost of local distribution and a reasonable dealer's profit to be allowed.) This margin, when duly fixed by order, together with the cost at the mine named by the president, the transportation charge and the jobber's commission, when sold to a jobber, will constitute the price to the consumer. The fuel administration will make public from its local committees in each community sufficient data to enable the individual consumer to ascertain for himself the established price.

Figures will be compiled showing the local needs so that if necessary the administration may apportion the coal mined with careful regard to the needs.

Operators to Co-operate. Much available coal has been sold under contract and as those agreements were made prior to the president's proclamation it is not the intention at present to interfere with carrying them out. This, therefore, limits the amount of fuel which may be placed on sale at the designated prices. It is expected, however, that by the voluntary co-operation of the operators and the people who have contracted coal sufficient to meet the retail requirements will be available and there will be no necessity for the government to exercise the powers of compulsion given under the Lever act.

## MONTANA RANGE STEERS TOP CHICAGO MARKET

A load of de-horned Montana steers, shipped by S. J. Harding of Roy to Clay Robinson Co., sold at \$15.50 at Chicago. They averaged 1,333 pounds.

Clay Robinson also sold for the Cooper & Hughes Land & Livestock company of Spionkop a load of de-horned Hereford steers at \$14.75, although they averaged only 1,280 pounds. For the same outfit two loads of grade Hereford range heifers were sold at 11 cents, averaging 1,020 pounds.

The Harding sale at \$15.50 breaks all records for range cattle. Clay Robinson last week topped the market also with two loads of de-horned, branded corn-fed Iowa Hereford steers at \$17.85. This stock averaged 1,473 pounds.

Chicago commission men look for a good range market all fall on account of the shortage of corn-fed stock. There will also be a big demand for stockers and feeders, owing to the bumper corn crop.
