

DIES ON WAY TO THE HOSPITAL

WILLIS DUDLEY, WELL KNOWN COLORED PORTER, IS DEAD.

Willis Dudley, a well known resident of the colored colony, died suddenly last night while being taken from his home to the county hospital in a hack. He had been sick only since the morning before. He lay ill until yesterday in his cabin behind the Eureka saloon, and the disease had too firm a grip on him to be counteracted by attendance. Dudley had been employed as a porter in Renfro's. He came here from Salt Lake, where he was well known in the majority of the large saloons in the capacity of porter. He had been married, but was divorced, and he leaves a daughter in Salt Lake.

RICH SAMPLES FROM TYBO MINE

HIGH GRADE ORE FROM THE THREE HUNDRED FOOT LEVEL.

It is getting to be an every day matter to make a rich strike in the Tybo mine, since the mine was cleaned of the water and refuse that had lain in the bottom of the shaft, and choked the lower levels for years. But the last find of a few days ago was the best that has yet been uncovered. It was on the three hundred foot level and there are some magnificent samples of the ore in the offices of the company in the State Bank and Trust Company building. Malcolm Macdonald has one piece, and it is not a small piece either, which goes eighty ounces in silver and sixty per cent in lead. How much of this they have is not known, as there has not been sufficient development work done to determine. But it would take a very little of it to make shipping a strong possibility, although the owners of the mine consider it a milling proposition.
