INDIAN MURDERERS GET TEN YEARS

LOS ANGELES, March 2.—Mrs. Dominga Segundo and Antonio Augustine, two Indians of the Morongo reservation, who killed John Segundo, husband of Mrs. Segundo, last October, were allowed to plead guilty in the Federal court today to the charge of manslaughter. Judge Wellborn sentenced each to ten years imprisonment.

STRIKE MENACES THE GOULD LINES

DENVER, Colo., March 2.—The News today says: After a short conference yesterday with General Manager Ridgely of the Denver and Rio Grande system, a committee of machinists employed on the system was informed that the company will abrogate its contracts after March 14, and after that date will not recognize the machinists, blacksmiths, car-repairers or boiler-makers unions. The committee will submit the question immediately to a referendum vote of all the employes belonging to those unions who are employed on the Gould roads.

It is claimed the men will not submit to the plan of the railroad company and that a general strike on all the Gould roads, excepting the International and Great Northern, is imminent. The machinists say the action of the company in working its employes only a few hours a day is arbitrary.

The company also announced yesterday that there would be a reduction of the wages paid telegraph operators.

GERMAN SAILOR STABS COMPANION

RICH ORE FROM SEVEN TROUGHS

The Mazuma Hills Leasing Company, operating the Reagan lease on the Mazuma Hills property, sent out a shipment of ore this week which is not only the first shipment to go out from any lease, but is the record shipment of the district in gross value. It is the fifth shipment of ore from the Mazuma Hills property, following within a week the latest high grade shipment from the company workings and the recently declared policy of the company henceforth to ship regularly, says the Seven Troughs Miner.

The present shipment consists of twenty-five tons of ore running up to more than \$3000 per ton, and averaging, according to a long assay record, better than \$1000 a ton. The shipment included 100 sacks of selected high grade, the general average of value of which is sensationally high. This latter consignment which immediately followed the main shipment, consists largely of specimen ore, some of which will run better than \$8 a pound. The entire shipment is believed to represent the greatest value in ore yet sent out of the district.

This consignment of high grade is the product of about two months work on the rich ore shoot uncovered from the Reagan incline shaft at approximately the 100-foot level, and is incidental mainly to the development and preparations of the lease for future production. Ever since Mr. Reagan struck the ore, a few men have been taking it out while the drift has been pushed south to connect with the working shaft about 200 feet distant and northward to determine the extent of the ore shoot in that direction. Neither of these objects have yet been attained, but, incidentally, one of the richest and most productive ore shoots in the district has been disclosed, the extent of which is yet unknown, the outlying ground not having been reached.

With connections soon to be made with the vertical working shaft, and the latter going steadily down, the Reagan lease will soon be in shape to tap its subterranean treasury in a systematic and thorough manner, and begin a regular shipping record that will add greatly to the fame and production of the district.

The ore bearing vein is large, well defined and strong, running almost north and south, and lying in a contact of porphyry with the black dike, the latter being on the west side of the vein instead of the east side, as with the great Mazuma Hills vein. The Reagan vein is but a few hundred feet from the Mazuma Hills vein, and is thought to lie against the dike as the latter. A string of lessees have blocks on the same ore zone, and one of the principal results of the shipment will be a great revival of activity on the other leases.

The Prior lease, adjoining the Reagan lease, has developed a rich ore shoot supposedly on the same vein from which a consignment of ore is being forwarded to the smelters. This is said to be part of a program to resume active operations on the lease, which recently temporarily closed down.

The ore of the Mazuma Hills Leasing Company has been sent to the smelters in Utah.
