RENEWED ACTIVITY AT CAMP STIMLER

W. B. Dunnell of Minneapolis paid a visit to the camp of Stimler the first part of the week, in company with Harry Stimler and Chas. D. Keading. A pretty thorough examination of the developments of the district was made, and the party, on their return Wednesday evening, expressed themselves well pleased with the showing being made. The party were escorted through the Pittsburg plant after their return to Blair, and were unanimous in pronouncing it a model institution, Mr. Dunnell especially being well pleased to know that his home town had had a hand in its construction.

Messrs. Stimler and Keading are quite confident that their district will soon be attracting attention, and samples brought in by them warrant the belief. A big piece of ore from the Rodenkirch lease was taken to Goldfield as a specimen, and Mr. Dunnell was loaded with specimens which he will take home with him. The gentlemen were out in the interest of a syndicate which has been negotiating for a considerable block of stock in the various holdings of Harry Stimler and associates.

Work was also begun in earnest this morning on a lease recently acquired by Pemberton, Annett, Trask and Davis. Timbers are being gathered on the ground preparatory to sinking 300 feet or more, which will be done without delay. The lease is on the east end of the Reno and consists of 400 feet along the ledge, and has also a junction with several cross

ledges from which good values have been obtained. A whim will be used until a hoist can be secured. By many that portion of the property is considered the most desirable, and the company think they will be able to get good values at comparatively shallow depths.
