KEARNS TO BUILD HIS OWN MILL

When "Honest" Tom Kearns starts on a project there is not the slightest vacillation until his end is attained. Hence, after listening to the many stories of mills on the way her from all different directions, he decided that the most feasible way to obtain action on the immense amount of sacked ore he has on the dumps was to build his own mill. After consulting with Messrs. King & Hunt, expert mill men, who decided that a Huntington mill was the best adapted for Rawhide ores, a plant has been ordered that will have a capacity of 200 tons a day. A complete cyaniding and concentrating plant will be used in conjunction. A carload of the ore is being sacked at present and when completed will be valued at \$125,000. There is thirty-nine inches of this on the Kearns No. 2 that will give the astounding values of \$49,900. This in itself should be enough to satisfy any ordinary Croesus, but the Kearns properties keep improving day after day and there seems to be no limit to the valuation.

BIG DEAL CLOSED FOR JUMBO MINE

By a deal concluded by the placing in escrow in the Scheeline bank of the deed to four claims in Jumbo, control was acquired by four men well known in Reno of what is believed by them to be the most desirable piece of property in the district which has lately sprung into so much prominence. Paul Buckley, the mining man, Attorney William H. Schnitzer, Charles Friedhoff and Manager Littler of the Western Union were the parties who acquired the property, and the consideration is said to have been \$29,000. Attorney Schnitzer stated that immediately after closing the deal they were offered \$10,000 for their bargain.

INTO THE GRAVE AFTER EVIDENCE

CHICAGO, Ill., April 4.—In the belief that they have unearthed a possible counterpart of the case of Herman Billek, now awaiting execution here for the poisoning of several members of the Vyzral family, county authorities caused to be exhumed the body of Charles Stroner, a well-to-do Bohemian, whose death a month ago is alleged by some members of his family to have been due to a "white liquor" administered shortly before his death. Both Billek and Mrs. Stroner are alleged clairvoyants and said to be possessed of hypnotic powers. Both are Bohemians. The alleged motive for the supposed murder of Stroner is the same as that in the case of the Vyzral family, a hope of profiting by insurance on the lives of the victims.
