## LA FOLLETTE HAS CARD UP SLEEVE

MILWAUKEE, Wis., May 19.—A "cross of gold" speech is now Senator La Follette's hope of success at the Chicago convention.

His friends have given up hope of his making a respectable showing of delegates, but it is understood that he will secure a proxy from Wisconsin and appear on the floor and on the first day deliver a notable oratorical effort. By this he hopes to win prominence in the race for 1912.

It is generally understood in Wisconsin that the campaign this year is made simply to give him a fighting chance in 1912, with the added argument that in 1908 he was downed by the corporations working through the Taft campaigners. He intends, after getting before the convention on the first day, to add to his program the nomination of Roosevelt. He hopes to make so striking an address that he can disrupt the Taft forces and bring about the Roosevelt nomination.

## MEXICO RESTRICTS BANK OFFICIALS

CITY OF MEXICO, May 19.—The committee on finance of Congress has reported favorably the bill prepared by Minister of Finance Jose Y. Limantour, for the regulation of chartered banks. The prime object of the measure is to protect depositors and to add to the solidity of the banks.

The proposed law prohibits officials of banks from borrowing funds from their own banks during the first year of the institutions. All loans must be amply secured. Loans of banks of issue are limited to persons of not more than two months.

The bill contains many other stringent regulations for chartered banks of issue.

The new clauses governing banks of promotion direct that deposits received by such institutions shall be protected by keeping on hand at least 20 per cent more either in cash or in first class securities, with the remaining 60 per cent in notes liable to discount and taken for no period longer than six months.

### ICE KING IN THE GAME.

NEW YORK, May 19.—The Morse Securities Company was incorporated in Maine last Saturday by Chas. W. Morse, fallen ice king and banker. The plans are even more masterful than those used in his former enterprises.

### TO ELEVATE SALOON STANDARD.

MILWAUKEE, Wis., May 19.—The United Brewers' Association will seek to elevate the standard of saloons by helping to prohibit the sale of liquors to minors. Several brewers of Cincinnati have offered their services as probation officers.

## STRIKE FLOW OF NATURAL GAS

RENO, Nev., May 19.—While boring for water on the island ranch owned by State Senator Douglass in Churchill county, laborers encountered a strong flow of natural gas. The find has created considerable excitement in the section, which is close to Fallon. The flow is strong and steady. The gas was lighted soon after it was discovered and burned several hours, or until it was extinguished by the laborers, who hurried to Fallon to report their find.

Arrangements even now are under way to pipe the gas to Fallon and surrounding mining camps. It is believed that the gas overlies an oil strata, the discovery of which means the solving of the fuel problem in Nevada.

LONDON, May 18.—Live "Teddy bears" have usurped the monkey, the Pekingese pug, the "Pom" and the poodles in the boudoirs of the smart women of the West End.
