ARRESTED FOR RAWHIDE ROBBERY

RAWHIDE, June 19.—Recently William Barnett's tent was broken into and \$400 stolen from his trunk. Tonight Ray Smith, former secretary of the Cooks' and Waiters' Union, was placed in jail by the State Police charged with the crime, and another, Bennett, was arrested on suspicion at Fallon.

Bennett, a cook, was about to leave for Greenwater to start in business. He was a passenger on the Schurz stage held up Saturday. When Smith was arrested when about to board the Fallon stage, he was seen to pass a roll of bills to Bennett, who left later on an automobile. Although the money found on Bennett is in bills, while the stolen amount was in gold, the coincidence in the amounts excites suspicion. The State Police declare the hammer used in the robbery was found in Smith's tent adjoining that of Bennett.
