## ACTION OFFENDS THE JAPANESE

TOKIO, July 14.—The news of the action of the Democratic National convention at Denver in including in its platform a plank favoring the exclusion from the United States of Asiatic laborers is taken here to be directed against Japanese and causing considerable surprise and displeasure. In some quarters indignation is expressed and the declaration is made that such a course is an infringement on the treaty rights of Japan and opposed to the principles of humanity that should govern the relations of nations. It is generally believed, however, by those familiar with political conditions in America, that the majority of Democrats are not anti-Japanese in sentiment and that the exclusion clause was incorporated in the platform for the purpose of satisfying the labor elements.

## HIGH GRADE ON THE ROYAL TIGER

The Royal Tiger has developed the fact that the west side of the district is just as rich as the east side; that the old sugar loaf has just as much wealth to go after as has the Balloon, Grutt or Hooligan hills. The work that has been going on on the Stinson lease of the Royal Tiger has been watched closely by the mining men of the camp, and there is no longer any doubt that the Royal Tiger is a mine. At a depth of 75 feet they have four and a half feet of ore that will go better than \$200 a ton.

This is a wonderful showing in any mine, and in any camp in the world. The Stinson lease was one of the first very rich finds that were made in the camp; it was, in fact, one of the strikes which set in motion the rush to Rawhide in the early days of the boom. The mining men who were first came to the camp with the rush, went into the hills of the Royal Tiger, and their examinations resulted in the verdict that at that place was one of the richest deposits in the camp. The ground about the sugar loaf was pretty well taken up, and the other parts of the district began making bids for notice by the extraordinary strikes which were being made on Balloon and Grutt hills. At that time there were some very nice showings on Hooligan, but they were little known of the properties over there.

For a time the Royal Tiger was forgotten by reason of the development work that was going on, but occasionally there was a big strike of gold and silver ore on the ledge upon which they were sinking, and then the air was full of "I told you so's." The ore went down to the 185 foot depth, and then pinched, and it was determined to start a drift at the 75-foot level. This was done and they went in for a distance of ninety feet without getting anything, and the work at this point was for the time being abandoned and sinking resumed. A few days ago they returned to the drift, and went in six feet further and struck the high grade ore again.

The importance of this find is that they have silver and gold in their high values, which indicates to

every mining man the permanency of the ore. The extent of the shoot cannot yet be determined, but the vein is looking better with every round of holes, and to add to the strength of the Royal Tiger, the ore is coming in at the lower depths to which the incline shaft was sunk.

The developments on the Royal Tiger have added to the interest of the west side of the camp, and the workers on the Bushwacker, the Wonder-King, Royal Coachman, Nevada King, and the rest of the properties in that vicinity, have redoubled their efforts in the pursuit of ore shoots, and the mine owners and the lessees are very well pleased with the chances that are ahead of them.—Rawhide News.

### IMPRISED AMERICANS.

WASHINGTON, July 13.—American Consul Ernest L. Small, at Smyrna, Turkey, has been instructed by the state department to investigate the report that 100 American citizens have been seized on the island of Nicaria and made prisoners by a Turkish warship. Adee took the initiative on the basis of the newspaper reports, no official information having reached the department. The department questions whether there are as many as 100 Americans on the island.
