The authorities of Providence and other cities were warned to be on the lookout for her.

## CASHIER MUST STAY IN JAIL

PITTSBURG, Aug. 18.—Efforts on the part of friends of William Montgomery, defaulting cashier of the Alleghany National bank to form a syndicate, whose object will be to secure the release of Montgomery on bail, have been thwarted. Announcement is made that if such a thing is attempted, a dozen or more additional charges of forgery will be entered against him, which would make it absolutely impossible to secure sufficient bail to get him out of jail. In addition to the prosecution by the federal authorities, the county authorities will prosecute the case rigorously.

Reports are current today that the names of several other persons will be dragged into the case, and that arrests of prominent residents on charges of forgery in assisting Montgomery to loot the bank will be made.

## HAVE DEMANDED POOLED STOCK

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Aug. 18.—It is reported that J. Le Briton, receiver for the California Safe Deposit and Trust company of San Francisco, Herman Zadig, a broker, Charles E. Hudson, a broker, and E. Woolley of J. A. Pollard and company, brokers, who are a majority of the committee in charge of the L. M. Sullivan Trust company securities pooled and deposited with the State Bank and Trust company, have called the return of the stock from Receiver Wildes of the bank.

It is stated that the stock has now a market value of over \$500,000 and that this is sufficient to pay off the L. M. Sullivan loan, the purpose for which the stock was pooled. T. B. Riekey and the members of the trust committee were in Reno last night.
