**TONOPAH GIRL IN THRILLING RIDE**

**RIDES BEHIND RUNAWAY HORSE AND LATER IS SAVED FROM DROWNING.**

A telegraphic dispatch from San Rafael says: Hurling from a runaway rig into the Lagunitas creek and escaping their peril on land only to be threatened by drowning in the water, was the exciting experience of Miss Dorothy Sheldon and Roswell Miller yesterday evening. Miss Sheldon, who is a well known society girl of Tonopah and the daughter of H. F. Sheldon, a broker of that place, was visiting her sister in San Anselmo when young Miller called to take her driving. Miller is the son of H. B. M. Miller, a prominent attorney of San Francisco, and is also an athlete of note in the Lowell high school.

The young couple enjoyed their drive without mishap until they reached Lagunitas on their return home, when the horse which Miller was driving became frightened at a rabbit running across the road and broke into a gallop. The road in that district is very narrow and dangerous, and as the horse increased his speed Miller guided him with the utmost difficulty. However, for over a mile he managed to keep the frenzied steed in the roadway, straining at the reins with all his strength, while Miss Sheldon clung to the seat, pale with terror.

Finally they approached a down grade, when the pace of the runaway animal became so great that the light rubber-tired buggy behind him bounced from side to side in a manner that made it only a question of time when the now thoroughly frightened occupants would be dashed over the embankment. At this time, Miss Sheldon, who is quite familiar with that part of the country, begged Miller to hold to the lines for a moment longer, until they reached a place where the roadway borders the Lagunitas creek.

"We must turn into that creek; it is our only chance," whispered the white-faced girl. As they reached the bank Miller tightened his grip on the lines, and suddenly, with a sharp pull to the left, swung the horse into the stream. There was a splash, a scream from Miss Sheldon and then a moment of oblivion for both. Miller was the first to come to the surface, but in an instance his fair companion arose beside him, choking for breath. It was only a short swim to shore, and Miller who has a record as a long distance swimmer, carried Miss Sheldon ashore with comparative ease, despite the fact that both were weighted down by their clothing. When they landed Miss Sheldon was faint with exhaustion, and it was some time before either of them began to wonder what had become of the horse and buggy. A brief search, however, soon revealed the animal caught in a clump of willows on the bank of the stream, still harnessed to the rig. Miller summoned aid from a nearby ranch house, and after some difficulty the horse and runaway were extricated from their predicament.

It was found that, save for a few scratches, the rig was uninjured, and the thankful couple were able to proceed on their way homeward with nothing more distressing than the sensation of wet chilly clothing to protect them from the chill evening air.
