**UREN NEARLY DROPPED DEAD**

STRAW VOTE TAKEN ON TRAIN STOOD 16 OUT OF 16 FOR JUDGE TAFT.

E. J. Uren, who since the loss of his place of business by the big fire which destroyed the block on Main street, has been traveling through the eastern and northern states, returned to Tonopah yesterday and expressed himself as pleased to be back. Said Mr. Uren:  
 "I have visited many places in my travels, but I am free to confess that none has appealed to me as has Tonopah. Whether it is the altitude or the class of people that live in Tonopah, I feel more at home and the business opportunities are far greater here than anywhere. I shall turn my attention to mining for awhile and will eventually take up a mercantile pursuit. Many business men in Minnesota and Wisconsin upon learning that I was from Nevada, piled me with questions upon conditions throughout the state. There is a growing interest in that section in our state and the people there are just waiting for conditions to return to the normal, which is now nearly to that point, when they will begin to let loose their savings and invest it in this state. The old hazard in the mining game has been effaced so that the resident of the non-mineral producing country is willing to take a chance with a prospect of getting a big return on his money, something which is nearly an impossibility in any other investment."  
 On the political situation, Mr. Uren said that everything seemed to be for Taft. "Why," said he, "to show which way the wind is blowing I drifted into the smoker yesterday morning as the train passed Blair Junction and there was one of those individuals who is always anxious as to the politics of the people with whom he comes in contact, proposed that a straw vote should be taken of the passengers in the car and when the vote was taken I nearly dropped dead, for of the sixteen in the car every blessed one of them was for Taft and Sherman."
