

# INDEPENDENCE LEAGUE MEETING

## The "Flying Wedge" Entertained Big Crowd in the Miners' Union Hall.

With a blare of brass horns and a roar of brass-lunged oratory, the so-called Independence party, the creation and especial pet of one William Disappointed Examiner Hearst, started its Nye county campaign in Miners' Union hall in Tonopah last night. The hall was well filled, not so much with gentlemen stumbling over themselves and each other in their unseemly haste to swear allegiance to this new Moses, as with those to whom "anything, Oh Lord, anything which will help to pass away the time" appealed strongly. Of course, besides the brass band, the assemblage heard several voices crying in the wilderness. The speakers of the evening were the Hon. Judge A. L. Fitzgerald, of Eureka; T. A. Sweeney, of Portland, Oregon; Zebediah W. Craig, of San Pedro, California, and the Right Rev. H. W. Knickerbocker, of the city of Rawhide, Nevada. They called themselves, on numerous handbills distributed about town, the "Flying Wedge of the Independence Party." Just why the "flying wedge" we did not ascertain. Probably it means "up in the air," as that is one of the definitions of "flying," although "flying" not only means being in the air, but making progress.

The speakers, between selections by the band, told of the issues of the campaign, as seen by them, and

elicited quite a bit of applause at times.

Mr. Craig referred to Switzerland, which country, he said, has more bank deposits of savings per capita of population, than any other country on the globe. He said that this had been accomplished through the people making and enforcing their own laws. Bryan he referred to as a politician in bad company, and inferentially, with impure motives.

T. G. Sweeney said that both the old line parties were drowned in Standard Oil. Bryan represents the small trusts, said he, and Taft the big ones. So far as Nevada is concerned, he said that both parties were owned by the Mine Owners' association. The speaker claimed that the police bill is unconstitutional as the constitution gives the state the right to call on the government in case of insurrection. Sweeney declared that Nevada's police bill was classed all over the country as the Russian or Czar measure of the state. In closing, he said: "If you want to maintain the present order of affairs, vote for Taft. If you want to lose your vote—vote for Bryan."

He added that the Independence party was strong after laws in favor of organized labor. Judge Fitzgerald and Mr. Knickerbocker also gave addresses along the same lines and were well received.

## DAVELER ENDORSED FOR THE ASSEMBLY

## INYO COUNTY FAIR WILL BE A BIG EVENT

**NEVADA PEOPLE WILL JOIN WITH THE INYO EXHIBITION AT BISHOP.**

The Inyo county, California, fair, which will be held at Bishop, October 13th to 18th, inclusive, will probably be attended by many people from this section, and this is as it should be. And Nye county should be well represented in the mining exhibit which will be held at the fair, as other sections of Nevada will have good exhibits there. This county can make as fine a showing as any of them, and the opportunity to effectually advertise the resources of Nye should not be overlooked.

The citizens of Bishop have raised a fund of over \$3000 to be used exclusively as purses and premiums. There will be live stock exhibits from both California and Nevada sections, agriculture and horticultural displays, showing every product of orchard, farm, vineyard and dairy, and a special pavilion has been constructed for the advantageous display of the Inyo county mineral products. Mono county will also have a great mineral exhibit, and the invitation has been extended to all the Nevada counties to participate likewise.

In addition to the industrial and commercial exhibits, there will be sports aplenty, as there will be four days of horse racing, baseball, etc. The Tonopah Mining company ball team, the Eagles-Elks and the Montana teams will join in the fun and help entertain the visitors. The Tonopah ten-piece band has been hired by the management of the fair for the four days. Other features will be a big barbecue on Friday afternoon, the last day of the fair, and on Saturday there will be a mammoth shooting tournament. This shoot will be affixed and ducks, geese, mountain and valley quail, snipe and cotton tail rabbits will all figure on the score card, the shoot to decide which side pays for a game supper. Permission has been secured to shoot over an area of nearly twelve miles square, with Bishop as the central point.

Special rates will be given on the railroads for the fair and an excursion train will leave Goldfield and Tonopah October 12, connecting with the Bishop train at Tonopah Junction, and arriving at Bishop at about 5 o'clock in the afternoon of that day.
