At about 8:30 Thursday morning they addressed a small crowd on a vacant lot on Main street, elucidating political problems of the day.

Both speakers gave their customary arraignment of the two old-line parties, and informed the crowd that the only way to salvation lay in voting the Hearstized ticket. Perhaps owing to the shortness of their stay, neither speaker attempted to secure any subscribers to the Examiner. Mr. Hisgen seemed to be a gentleman with explicit confidence in himself.
