## THE FORESTRY SCHEDULE HAS BEEN REVISED

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 28.—Following the statement made a year ago at the meeting of the National Wool Growers' association in Salt Lake City, Gifford Pinchot, forester, and A. F. Porter, in charge of grazing in national forests have announced a reduction of 10 to 15 per cent in the rates for sheep grazing on national forests to take effect the coming season. Changes in market conditions which have made the sheep business less profitable this past year, especially the greatly reduced prices offered for wool and the depreciation in the value of mutton, are partly responsible for this reduction. In 1907, when promises for the reduced schedule were made, it was with the understanding between the stockmen and forest service that the grazing rates would not be changed for minor fluctuations in the market which would naturally occur from year to year, but would apply only in cases of radical or unusual changes.

The new schedule does not affect the cases where a minimum charge of 5 cents per head has already or a specially low rate has been fixed on account of some local condition. In most cases the revised fees will mean the reduction of about one cent per head. In fixing the rates for grazing of different kinds of stock on forest growth demand for for use of range by owners of different kinds of stock needs of homesteaders and profits of business have been taken into consideration.
