## A SECOND MOHAWK IS AT CLIFFORD

W. C. Rannell, manager of the Broken Hills mine at Clifford, talks as enthusiastically about that property as when he had charge of the wonderful Hayes-Monnette lease on the Mohawk. He is not in the habit of saying anything about a property of which he is in charge unless to tell the straight facts. Friday he said: "The Broken Hills is a great mine. I brought in grab samples from a fifty-ton shipment taken from a body of ore five feet wide, that went at the rate of \$659 a ton, and the values were distributed at the rate of twenty-six ounces in gold and 259 ounces silver. At the 100-foot level in the incline shaft there is ten feet of ore that, as it is shot down, assays better than \$300 a ton. There are at least 2000 tons already blocked out of this kind of quartz, and drifts have been started on the ore shoot. We are working about fifteen men, but that is enough until the ground is opened up, as the produc-

tion is greater than what can be hauled away. All the ore is being hauled to Tonopah at a cost of \$20 per ton. We do not mind that, considering the grade of the ore, as you know distance and expense of hauling never interferes with production when the right kind of ore is in sight."—Goldfield Tribune.
