FLORENCE IS PAID UP ON BULLION TAX

CHECK FOR OVER \$10,000 RECEIVED AND COMPANY ADMITS LIABILITY.

GOLDFIELD, June 26.—A check for \$10,018.49 was received yesterday by the district attorney from the Florence Goldfield, in full payment of the bullion tax for the last quarter of last year, including penalty and fees of the district attorney. The bullion tax for the first quarter of the present year does not become delinquent until Monday next, but it is highly probable that it will be paid in due time.

Before Judge Somers, the district attorney, read section 4628 of the Nevada statutes, which provides for discharge of a defendant in a misdemeanor case providing reparation is made. Mr. Tilden stated that the Florence company has made a public acknowledgment of the rights of the state and county in every respect, and had delivered the check named in full payment for bullion tax, with penalty and fees for the last quarter of last year.

Judge Somers stated that he desired to congratulate the grand jury which so conscientiously looked into the bullion tax matter. A month ago yesterday the attention of the court was called to the bullion tax case and, upon investigation, the court found a violation of the law. The judge added that the investigation has been under the direction of the district attorney, and that the people of the county are to be congratulated for the fearless discharge of duty by the district attorney and grand jury.

BERG HAS HEARING.

SAN BERNARDINO, June 25.—The preliminary hearing of Hans Berg, ex-attendant at the Patton insane asylum on the charge of man-

slaughter growing out of the death of Harry Grassmere, a patient, was begun in Justice Thomas' court today. District Attorney Byrne went into the evidence in great detail.

IMMENSE WEALTH IN KEANE WONDER

RHYOLITE, June 25.—Yesterday Mr. Wilson and Mr. Chapman paid a friendly visit of inspection to the mines of Pioneer, returning in the evening. Shortly after their return Mr. Wilson was called to the telephone by the superintendent at the Keane Wonder mine, who stated that he had been calling for him all day, and wondered where he was. Mr. Wilson explained that he had visited Pioneer. The superintendent replied:

"Well, you need not go to Pioneer to see a big mine, for the Keane Wonder is now greater than anything at Pioneer. We have crosscut forty feet and no hanging wall in sight—over forty feet of ore that averages better than \$25; some of it goes as high as \$60 to the ton, and more coming up. This ore carries more sulphurets and some lead, and is very irregular."

The crosscut is in the vein opened up by the new shaft, and is developing a body of ore separate and distinct from that which has been supplying the mill in the past. This immense ore deposit demands increased milling facilities and makes necessary a greater water supply.

The delight of Mr. Wilson was beyond expression.
