### M'CORMACK WILL SHIP A CARLOAD A DAY

After the tenth of the present month, the McCormack lease, which was formerly the Elgin-Randall property, will commence to ship a carload of ore daily. This is indeed good news to the outside public, as several different sets of operators have been waiting until the second steady shipper was added to the list. Manager Tom Murphy is the authority for the above, and he states that at the present time his company is shipping about thirty tons daily, which adds materially to the output of the famous Luckyboy district. As soon as enough ore has been blocked out by development, a greater force of men will be put on and in all probability the McCormack will equal the present bonanza shipper, the Hubbard.—Hawthorne-Luckyboy Post.

### WINTER RETURNS ON JULY FIFTH

There are few towns in the United States that can boast of having all the joys of winter weather in July. During the day, Monday, while the big celebration was in progress, the air was unusually cool, the mercury dropping more as evening approached. At 7 o'clock the air was chilly, at 9 o'clock it was cold and by 11 o'clock the inhabitants, clad in their summer garments, were actually suffering from the cold. The thermometer registered below freezing at midnight, and by morning water barrels, pipes, etc., were pretty well frozen up. An icicle six inches long was found on a barrel back of the Evans building.
