Tonopah Mining was the feature and closed strong with a raise of 7 1/2 points. Extension was next in line, having advanced 3 points. Belmont went up 2 cents, while MacNamara took an advance of a point. Montana, after the sensational rise of the past two days, declined 2 points. Midway and West End both lost a point.

Goldfield Consolidated was the feature among the sister city's stocks and advanced 12 1/2 points, while Fraction recovered 2.

GREAT ACTIVITY IN MANHATTAN'S MINES

(From the Manhattan Mail.) LEE-MEISSNER LEASE.

Lee and Meissner, leasing on the Toiyabe Gold Mining company's ground, have their crosscut out from the 175-foot level forty-five feet, and they expect to cut the ledge within the next thirty feet. The ledge for which they are crosscutting gave good milling values on the surface, and if the same values are encountered in the present workings, they will have over 200 feet of backs.

WORK RESUMED ON NEMO.

Hugh Dolan, of Pottsville, Pennsylvania, general manager of the Nemo Mining company, has arrived in camp and has put a force of men to work on the company's property at Cent. The showings on this ground are among the best in the district and it has prospects of making a big mine.

ORE EXHIBIT WILL BE GREAT.

J. H. Tait, the Goldfield mining engineer, was a Manhattan visitor last Thursday, coming here in the interests of local properties which he represents. Mr. Tait is the mineralogist in charge of the mineral exhibit at the mining congress to be held in Goldfield in September, and he stated that the ore exhibit here this fall will be one of the greatest ever seen in the United States.

HOIST FOR MINERAL HILL.

On Monday, of this week, the Wittenberg Warehouse and Transfer

company delivered a gasoline hoist to the Mineral Hill Mining company at East Manhattan. The main shaft on this property is down 280 feet, and it is the intention of the company to sink to the 300-foot level and then make a crosscut to the ledge.

ROUND MOUNTAIN BULLION.

Frank Datesman, chauffeur for the Round Mountain Mining company, pulled the company's new Pope-Hartford into Tonopah this morning. On the rear seat, packing a veritable arsenal, was Clarence Sage, chief detective of the Goldfield Consolidated Mines company. At the detective's feet was a yellow leather pouch that did not appear to be very bulky, but its weight was more than one man would care to pack. This pouch contained the semi-monthly clean-up of the Round Mountain company's mill. The bullion was taken in to Goldfield where it will be deposited in the vaults of the John S. Cook bank, before forwarding it to the mint.

INDEPENDENCE TO ERECT MILL.

George H. Bradford, a mining engineer of Oakland, arrived in Manhattan last Friday, by auto, having made the run from the coast city in the remarkably short time of fifty hours. The distance covered is nearly 600 miles and over some of the worst roads in the west. The car used was a 24-horsepower Lambert, which has been in constant use for three years. In the early days

of Rawhide, Mr. Bradford erected a mill there and he is now in Manhattan examining the Manhattan Independence property, below Central, preparatory to moving the plant to that property from Rawhide.

EARL LEASERS IN GOOD PAY ROCK

On the Martin-Wardell lease on the Manhattan Earl company's ground, an incline shaft has been sunk to a depth of forty-five feet on a cross ledge. They have two feet of ore that will average about \$20 to the ton. It is the intention of the leasers to follow this lead until they strike the main ledge.

On the Swanson lease on block five, the work consists of drifting and stoping in the south and west drifts, at the 150-foot level. They have three and one-half feet of ore in the north drift that will average \$25 per ton. Within the next few days the work of stoping to the 100-foot level will commence. The last ore taken out from this lease that

was milled went \$41 per ton. They have at least 300 tons of ore blocked out on the 150-foot level that will average around \$35 per ton. When this is taken out the work of sinking will be resumed.

Mushett and associates are running a drift from the 100-foot level, of block five, and when they reach block six they will up-raise a shaft. Mushett and associates have also secured a lease on the Forman Fraction ground, a Consolidated property, adjoining the Earl.—Manhattan Mail.
