PROF. JENNY IS PLANNING WORK ON MANHATTAN CON.

According to information received at this office yesterday, it appears that the Manhattan Consolidated Mines company's property is soon to be the scene of active lease operations.

Prof. W. P. Jenny, E. M. Ph. D., who enjoys the distinction of being one of the foremost mining engineers of the country and who for a number of years was United States geologist, was in Manhattan three weeks ago, looking over the properties of the Consolidated and Earl. It was not his first inspection of the mines on Ligation hill, and every time that he has visited that section he has expressed himself as being highly pleased with the showings. On his last trip here he remained in the camp three days, and devoted much of that time around the Consolidated. New word comes that he is in the east for the purpose of raising funds to start active work on a block of the Consolidated ground, which it is understood he has secured under lease. It is his intention to sink a shaft 500 feet deep, and he believes, after having made several exhaustive examinations of the ground, that he will be richly rewarded.

MUCH NEW WORK PLANNED AT PIONEER

The Jim Dandy company will start early in the year operating on its group at Pike's Peak, adjoining the McLelland & Lennon property. It now has a shaft down 20 feet and a gasoline hoist installed. It has a good showing for ore and a comfortable treasury.

The Puritan company, of Boston people, under the supervision of E. S. Giles, will commence operations in January.

The Puritan Savage company, composed of Massachusetts people, will resume operations next month. This group is about one mile west of town. It has two shafts, one of which is 100 feet deep, carrying good milling values, and also some lateral work.

The Pioneer Mines Consolidated, after all present litigation is terminated, will probably begin a system of vigorous development early the coming year. It is possible that the first work will be done in the ground of the old Rickard-Garberg lease, where now exist good ore showings susceptible of development.—Rhyolite Herald.
