was with us but twenty-five years for he did not go with us to Europe, but he never regarded that as a separation. As the children grew up he was their guide. He was with us in New Hampshire last summer and his hair was just as black, his eyes were just as blue, his form just as straight and his heart just as good as on the day we first met. In all the long years Patrick never made a mistake. He never heard an order; he never received a command. He knew. I have been asked for my

ideal of an ideal gentleman, and I give it to you—Patrick McAleer."

**W. P. ROAD MAY LOSE ITS IDENTITY**

REPORT THAT DENVER & RIO GRANDE WILL ABSORB LATEST GOULD ROAD.

By Associated Press DENVER, Feb. 16.—Absorption of the Western Pacific railroad, name and all, by the Denver and Rio Grande railroad and the operation of the transcontinental line, formed by the two working in conjunction, with Denver as headquarters for the enlarged system, is the prediction made today upon information claimed to be semi-official. Regarding the proposed consolidation a Denver and Rio Grande official is quoted as follows: "We do not know for a certainty that this move is going to be made. But much more improbable things have been done in railroad consolidation. It is not a wild dream, by any means." It is pointed out that the Western Pacific with its 921 miles of track, is practically only an extension of the Denver and Rio Grande, with its 2,600 miles of road; that the Rio Grande owns \$50,000,000 of the \$75,000,000 capital stock of the Western Pacific.

**PINE NUT COMPANY MAY RESUME**

While here he made a visit to the Pine Nut property, in which he is one of the heaviest owners. It is understood that a move is on to re-organize the company and a plan of development formed. The Pine Nut adjoins the Consolidated on the east and is considered one of the best properties in the district. George Wist is looking after the property for the company.—Manhattan Mail.
