BELMONT STOCK IS BOOSTED STRONG IN PHILADELPHIA

Eastern Mining Magazine Predicts Big Rise in Local Stock Before Many Months Pass.

An eastern mining paper, in commenting on the Nevada stocks, gives considerable space to Belmont, from which the following excerpt is taken. The article, which gives the local property a strong boost, was written by a correspondent at Philadelphia. It says:

"Take the statement of C. A. Higbee, treasurer of the Tonopah Mining company, who walked through the property a few days ago. To quote him: 'It is hard to convey on paper or put into words the wonderful ore body the Belmont has. It is the most marvelous thing I ever saw in the camp.' Now, this comes from a man of high standing integrity, who does not own a share of the stock. Furthermore, he is familiar with the Tonopah camp, and especially the Tonopah mine, from its infancy. Why should he come out to a close personal friend with this obdurate is a quandary to me—unless it is true.

"Consider, further, the letter I saw from an assayer in Tonopah, who, in writing to a personal friend the other day, said:

"The Belmont made a wonderful strike some time ago, and there is no 'bull' about it, as I have had the pleasure of visiting the mine three times during the past two months. (this letter was dated March 1) and I must say that I consider it the most wonderful strike made in the camp. The strike was made on the 1100-foot level and a very large, strong ledge was found, without any signs of a fault or break. Cal Brougher was telling me the other day 'the average of the belt for the past week has been in the neighborhood of \$200.' I cannot understand why the stock remains around \$1.50 and not away over the \$2 mark, as the showings are better than anything I ever saw in the camp. People have paid as high as \$1.75 for the stock, and I consider it a good buy at that price. I ran down a piece of rock out of the face which assayed 3,000 ounces in silver and 30 ounces in gold, so I examined the rock carefully and I found considerable free gold."

"I further learned today that the bugbear of the rich mines—high grading—had sprung up. Judging from a piece of rock I saw in Clyde

low the \$2 mark, and brought suit against the officers and directors of the company, on the grounds that false statements had been made. OPERATION WILL PROVE SUCCESSFUL

An operation that promises to prove entirely successful was performed yesterday at Reno upon Frank Everett, who killed Foreman Malone of the Mina shops four years ago.

The operation was performed at the St George hospital and was such an unusual and delicate one that eight doctors participated in or were spectators.

A portion of the occipital bone nearly two inches square was removed and a portion of the brain which was diseased, was taken out. The skull was then trephined and within an hour the patient was conscious and is now talking rationally.

Everett, it will be remembered, had for his defense in the murder case, his epileptic condition, which was laughed at by the alienists, but now has been demonstrated to having been due to the presence of a needle in his brain, which was there since his boyhood.

A strong movement has been started to secure his pardon if he recovers.

BLAIR MINING CASE IN THE SUPREME COURT

Litigation involving title to the claims operated by the Pittsburg-Silver Peak Mining company at Blair is occupying the attention of the state supreme court at Carson City today.

Among the attorneys and interested parties present are Rush Taggart and Clarence Mitchell of New York City, John Wheeler and Samuel Kelly of Pittsburg, John W. Dorsey of San Francisco and Attorney Gibbons of Reno.

The property involved in this litigation is one of the richest gold holdings in the state. It is equipped with a mill of 120 stamps and has paid off its indebtedness and acquired a splendid treasury. The Gamble case, as it is called, has been in the courts for the past ten years.
