## REPRESENTATIVE OF THE B. OF L. F. IS IN TONOPAH

### ARRIVES FROM SACRAMENTO TO ADJUST WAGE PROBLEM HERE.

A. Phillips, a representative of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen, with headquarters at Sacramento, arrived yesterday and spent the afternoon in consultation with the local officials of the Tonopah and Goldfield railroad, discussing the wage problem. E. Carrigan, representing the engineers and trainmen, who arrived last week, was also at the conference.

No satisfactory adjustment was reached and the meeting last night ended with the same result. The employees of the road have stated that they will not accept the reduction in wages that will average about a 40 per cent cut, when they were notified of the decrease, which was to become effective on the first of April. It is thought that an adjustment will be reached before the time specified approaches.
