WINS WILD RACE AGAINST DEATH

PITTSBURG, Pa., May 11.—Word has just been received in this city of the victory against time of Charles J. McIntosh, a prominent Milwaukeean, whose wild dash half way around the world to the bedside of his father in Naples, Italy, attracted nation-wide attention two weeks ago. Travelers declare Mr. McIntosh's successful race was a wonderful accomplishment. His father was alive when he arrived on April 17.

It took him just ten days between Milwaukee and the Italian port, that being the fastest time ever accomplished between the middle western states and Naples, according to steamship officials.

Mr. McIntosh departed from Milwaukee at 10 o'clock on the morning of April 6th, after having received a cablegram telling of the serious illness of his aged father. Arriving in Chicago at noon, and speeding to a steamship office in a taxicab, he discovered that the steamship La Touraine was scheduled to sail at 9:30 the following morning. Connection by train looked doubtful.

He engaged passage in Chicago, wired ahead to the Pennsylvania at Jersey city to engage a tug and boarded the fastest train—the Pennsylvania special, the eighteen-hour train between New York and Chicago. He departed from the windy city at 2:45 p. m., April 6th. The following morning at 3:45 he slept aboard the waiting tug, on the west bank of the Hudson river and steamed straight for the La Touraine, where willing hands boosted Mr. McIntosh and his two suit cases aboard and waved him a happy good-bye.

The time between New York and Naples is nine days. Failure to make connections would have meant a wait of a week until another ship sailed for Naples. The vessel arrived in Naples on time, the morning of the 16th and Mr. McIntosh found his father still living. His race against death won.

He then cabled his thanks to the Pennsylvania officials along with the fact that he had arrived on time.


