HEARST NEWS-PAPER BLOW HOT AND THEN COLD

STRING OF DAILIES NOW TRYING HARD TO KILL THE FIGHT GAME.

The San Francisco Examiner is now heading a crusade against prize fighting and proposes to wipe out the sport all over the United States. While the Journal has no desire to throw a single straw in the way of the Examiner's work, one cannot help recalling the way the Examiner boosted the Jeffries' end of the fight for months prior to the time when Professor Johnson placed a lasting quietus upon the aspirations of Professor Jeffries to continue as the pugilistic hope of the white race. Various sporting writers, so-called, assured the gaping public that Jeffries was in such superb condition that there was no possible chance for him to lose. The leading writer on the Examiner, a Mr. McNaughton, dilated daily upon the fact that Jeffries had "come back," and was fit to go one hundred rounds. The assurance given the public was invariably accompanied by a picture of Mr. McNaughton himself, who, according to the Examiner, was the leading authority of the world on future events in pugilism. The continual touting of the Jeffries end of the game caused thousands of suckers to bet their money on the white man until the odds became purely fictitious and caused millions of dollars to be dumped into the pool rooms to back a man who was not fit to fight twenty rounds with soft gloves. Now, either we must conclude that the Examiner lent its columns to boost the odds on Jim Jeffries in the interests of the pool rooms, or else we are forced to the conclusion that the writers of the paper are the veriest dubs in the business and cannot tell an athlete from a candidate for the consumptive ward of a county hospital. We have noticed of late that the pug writers of the paper no longer put their pictures in the sporting columns of the paper. It is refreshing to know that they have taken a drop on themselves. It is a matter of history that the Examiner has not picked a pugilistic winner during the last twenty years. A sporting man who would copper the Examiner's advice in that line could make a fortune every two years betting against the man they tout to win.

FIND BONES OF PREHISTORIC MEN

SKELETONS DISCOVERED IN A CAVE IN EL DORADO CO., CALIFORNIA.
AUBURN, Cal., August 1.—The bones of two prehistoric human beings with low brows and heavy jaws have been found in an ancient cave in limestone deposits which are being opened up near Cool, in El Dorado county. The men and employs the cave and recover any curios it might possess. Eugene C. Flint of Cool and Henry Ross of this city were employed in the work, and they have in one chamber found portions of two human skeletons. They are believed to be those of members of a race that inhabited this country long before the Indians. A large lake has been found in another part of the cave.
