ELECTRIC POWER FOR NEVADA MINES

Mono County Water Will Turn the Wheels of Industry on the Nevada Desert.

The new electric power company, which has run its surveys from Mono lake to Rawhide, Wonder and Fairview, is making every endeavor to complete construction work before fall. By furnishing the above Nevada camps with power there will be a revival in mining lines on an economic basis. Any of the desert camps are handicapped where they have to burn gasoline and the introduction of electric power means the mill treatment of ores that otherwise would be thrown over the dump as too low grade to handle at a profit. It is expected that the new corporation will be landing power in the camps by the first of the year. The camps of Aurora, Bodie, and Lucky Boy are already

feeling the effects of this new power line and extensive works are being carried on in anticipation of the installation.

The Bodie Miner has the following to say concerning the new company:

"Extensive operations seem to be the order of the day in connection with the Hydro-Electric company's plant at Lundy and Jordan. Neil McLean, who had charge of some of the grading and construction contracts, on the various railroads built in Nevada during recent years, has taken a contract to erect a dam at the foot of Lundy lake, fifty feet in length and extending across the entire canyon at that point. A large number of men will be employed and about 60 mules and all necessary machinery are on the road between here and Carson City on their way to the scene of operations. It is said that the contract price for the dam is \$250,000 and will be in accordance with the latest method with reference to strength and stability.

The immense pipe line which is being constructed from the lower end of the lake to the old town of Jordan is a fine specimen of engineering skill. Commencing at the outlet of the lake, the pipe, which is about four feet in the clear, follows the north side of the canyon, a moderate fall being given to the first few miles, gradually winding around the mountain side, the pipe being laid in a deep ditch along the side of the mountain, and will ultimately be covered over with earth, so as to prevent all possibility of freezing. The material for making the pipe consists principally of wooden staves about twenty feet long, and made so as to readily conform to the desired shape, when the staves are bound by rods of iron, each about a half inch in diameter, and placed about six inches apart in the shape of hoops or bands which are tightened by nuts at the end of the iron rods.

The staves and rods remain straight until ready for use, as convenience in shipping.

"The entire volume of water through this pipe will have an abrupt fall of about 1,500 feet when it reaches the point where it is to drop over the mountain side onto the wheel of the generator. During this rapid descent the water will be confined in iron pipes, gradually tapering from where it leaps over the precipice to the point where it is discharged onto the generator. This power site is one of the most valuable in the Sierra Nevada mountains.

"The large volume of water which finds its way from the eastern slope of the mountains, through Lundy canyon and thence into Mono lake, within a few miles after leaving the mouth of the canyon, presents a never-falling supply of the purest kind of water. The company has already acquired title to all land and water rights bordering on the stream, and all rights cease when the fresh water mingles with the waters of the lake."

BUCKSKIN MINE MERGER.

Plans for the merging of the properties of the Buckskin mining district into the Yerington Copper Merger Mining and Smelting company are being rounded out in Goldfield by A. J. McDaniel, general manager of the new concern. The company is capitalized for \$5,000,000 and its stock is all assessable, with no promotion stock to be issued. The territory to be embraced in the consolidation is about six miles long and from one-half to three miles wide.

About \$65,000 has been expended upon development work in the various properties which show strong deposits of copper. The district is about fourteen miles from Wabuska. The new copper belt railroad passes within four miles of the camp, however, and it is believed that a branch line will be built to Buckskin. The headquarters of the company is in Goldfield.—Salt Lake Herald-Republican.

SUMMONS.

IN THE DISTRICT COURT OF the Fifth Judicial District of the State of Nevada in and for the County of Nye.

Ellen G. Oddie, Alice T. Oddie and Montana-Tonopah Mining Company, a corporation, plaintiff, vs. Mae Zawaskie, John Doe, Richard Roe, Peter Doe and Jane Doe, defendants.

Action brought in the District Court of the Fifth Judicial District of the State of Nevada, in and for the County of Nye, and the complaint filed in said County of Nye, in the office of the Clerk of said District Court.

The State of Nevada sends greetings to Mae Zawaskie, John Doe, Richard Roe, Peter Doe and Jane Doe, or defendants.

You are hereby required to appear in an action brought against you by the above-named plaintiff in the District Court of the Fifth Judicial District of the State of Nevada, in and for the County of Nye, and to answer the complaint filed therein, within ten days (exclusive of the day of service) after the service on you of this summons, if served within this county; or, if served out of this county, but in this district, within twenty days; otherwise, within forty days; or judgment by default will be taken against you, according to the prayer of said complaint.

The said action is brought to quiet title to the "Miriam" mining claim, adjoining the "Montana-Tonopah" group on the north, situated in the Tonopah Mining district, Nye county, Nevada; and to compel the defendants to set forth the nature of any adverse claims to said property and any claim they, or any of them, may have to any interest or right to or in said property or any part thereof; and to obtain from said court a judgment and decree declaring the plaintiffs to be the sole and absolute owners of said property and declaring the defendants, and each of them, to be utterly without any right, title or interest to or in said property; and debarring each and all of the defendants from asserting any claim whatsoever in or to said "Miriam" mining claim or any part thereof; and granting such further relief as to the court may seem proper.

And you are further notified that if you fail to appear and answer said complaint as above required, said plaintiff will apply to the court for the relief demanded therein.
