She was hastened to the Miners' hospital and today was reported to be out of danger. The cause of the deed could not be ascertained, for Hattie stated that she had taken the tablets accidentally and had no intention of suiciding.

GREAT WESTERN HORNSILVER MINE IN NEW HANDS

LARGE SUM IS PAID TO S. H. BRADY TO REDEEM PROPERTY.

The deal for the Great Western mine at Hornsilver was closed yesterday at Goldfield and the property turned over to Andrew J. Trumbo, of Bonnie Clare, as trustee for himself and associates under a bond and lease, after \$15,701.50 had been paid to the sheriff's office to redeem the property under mortgage of \$13,000 to S. H. Brady of Tonopah, and under which it was sold by order of foreclosure May 27 last. The redemption was made in the name of the Great Western Gold Mining and Milling company, the money being provided by Mr. Trumbo, as trustee, for himself and associates. Ten thousand dollars was paid in bank notes and the balance in gold, and afterwards carried to a local bank by Deputy Sheriffs Stewart Myers, J. P. Donnelley and others. Attorney George B. Thatcher of this city was present at the consummation of the deal, representing Mr. Brady.
