

OPERATIONS WILL BE RESUMED ON THE JIM BUTLER GROUND

Board of Directors at the Annual Meeting in Philadelphia, Authorize the Resumption of Operations.

The following is taken from a Philadelphia newspaper of recent date and is of considerable interest to the people of Tonopah:

"A special meeting of the directors of the Tonopah Belmont Development company was held yesterday to hear the report of President Park, who returned last week from a trip to the mines. President Park explained in detail the condition of the mines as was outlined on this page last week. He announced that the new shaft has attained a depth of 1140 feet and that operation would begin December 1.

"Following the meeting of the Tonopah Belmont, meetings of the directors of the Jim Butler and Goldfield Belmont, which are about the same as of Tonopah Belmont, were held. The directors authorized the resumption of work on the Jim Butler. The first work will be cross-cutting in the Stone Cabin shaft, where ore has been taken out heretofore. The directors decided to open up the property on an extensive scale. It was announced that the company is in financial position to operation for company

account. For some time past the company has granted leases on its property. A statement regarding Goldfield Belmont will probably be made some day this week.

"It was reported that the Goldfield Annex is shipping ore of a good quality and that last week a four-foot vein was struck, which assays well."

It was stated in the Bonanza some time ago that plans were being worked out that would lead to the resumption of operations in the Jim Butler. It is understood that the company has about 350,000 shares of stock in the treasury and there will be no trouble in securing a working fund. The stock has always been in demand and hardly a day passes without sales being recorded. There is a probability that the gasoline hoist on the Stone Cabin shaft will be replaced with an electric hoist, but this may not result until the work is under way. It will be necessary to install a new hoist if greater depth is to be secured, but if crosscutting is the only work in view, then the present apparatus will prove capable of carrying out the work.

M. Katen, W. D. Murray and William L. Tierney, who will conduct it as an up-to-date thirst parlor. Many improvements will be made in the place to add to its comfort and attractiveness.

With the abolishment of gambling the owners, E. S. (Kid) Highley, Ole Elliott and Johnny May, decided to retire from the business and gave a lease to some of their former employes, who had proven popular with the public. Elliott has planned an extensive trip to South America and Highley and May have other large business interests outside of Goldfield.—Tribune.

OPHIR MINING COMPANY IS SELF SUSTAINING

The bullion tax paid at the assessor's office at Virginia City by the Ophir Silver Mining company for the quarter ending September 30, 1910, was \$661, and the statement furnished by the company for the bullion tax collector gives some very interesting information as to what that mine has been doing for the three months previous to that date, or to be more exact, for the two months, that being the time of the last run at the mill. The tax paid represents the extraction and milling of 2088 tons of ore, the gross yield of which was \$77,197.51, giving a net yield of \$18,050.06, that being the amount on which is figured the income to the county and state. The statement also gives the entire expenses for that period, mining, pumping, et., as \$50,771.43; transportation, \$1,658.14; reduction and cost of marketing concentrates, \$6,007.88. It will be seen at once that the last milling therefore not only paid all the operating expenses, but left on hand as the net yield, the sum set forth above, which is considered an excellent showing, putting the property on a solid, self-sustaining basis.—Mining Record.
