**NEVADA PEOPLE WIN IN FIGHT FOR LARGE ACREAGE**

**ARE GRANTED POSSESSION OF LARGEST SALT DEPOSIT IN THE WORLD.**

O. J. Gutke, a former railroad man, and well-known in Reno, now with the Montello Salt company, is in Reno in the interest of the company he represents. When the new salt beds at Montello were opened up Mr. Gutke, with many other railroads, stampeded to the scene and was among the first locaters of the salt lands. Over 40,000 acres of land were taken up under placer locations.

Title to the property was disputed by the state of Utah, but after carrying the fight to the higher courts the original locaters won out, the final decision having been handed down by the United States supreme court on May 29.

The salt beds, which lie on the main line of the Western Pacific railroad about 112 miles west of Salt Lake City, range from four to fourteen feet in depth, and the pure salt is extracted. It is estimated that over 150,000,000 tons of salt can be extracted from the beds, and it is calculated as the largest deposit of its kind in the world.

A company has recently been incorporated and Mr. Gutke is interested in the placing of the shares upon the market.

**KILBANE WAS GIVEN DECISION OVER KLINE**

**BATTLE WITH PATSY KLINE IN LOS ANGELES GOES THE LIMIT.**

LOS ANGELES, Cal., July 17.—Johnny Kilbane of Cleveland, Ohio, was given the decision at the end of his twenty-round fight with Pat Kline of Newark, at Vernon arena Saturday night. With the exception of Kilbane's clever boxing and fancy footwork, the only feature of the fight was Kline's knockdown in the eighth, when he caught Kilbane with a terrific left swing to the jaw and stretched him on the floor in a neutral corner. Kilbane took the count of five and thereafter was more skillful in ducking or backing away from Kline's attempts to land. Eddie Smith of Oakland refereed.

Kilbane apparently had every blow in the pugilistic repertoire at his command and landed each frequently, without embarrassing the sturdy Kline. The latter's chief stock in trade was a wild swing with either hand and a kidney punch in the clinches.

Kilbane will meet Joe Rivers at Vernon Labor Day in a twenty-round bout at 122 pounds.

In the first preliminary Babe Picato stopped Bob Monroe of San Francisco in three rounds. In the second preliminary Paul Kohler of Cleveland pounded Charlie Dalton all over the ring for 15 rounds, but could not knock the tough local lad out. Kohler was given the decision.
