

SLABS OF GOLD ARE BEING TAKEN OUT

Richest Ore Ever Mined In the State Is Being Mined at the Adamson-Turner Property Near Winnemucca.

The Humboldt Star, published at Winnemucca, furnishes the following account of the great gold discovery near that town:

Slabs of almost solid gold are now being extracted from the famous Adamson-Turner property at Rexall, the Winnemucca mountain camp. Some of the richest gold ore yet found in the west is being daily extracted from the workings, but the extraction the latter part of last week capped the climax for rich ore. In one of the shafts now being opened in this property there is a streak that is producing ore that is so rich in the precious yellow metal that it can be bent like a piece of lead with the hands. It is wonderfully rich ore that only needs to be melted down to be put into bars. The most significant feature of this find is that this fabulous ore is coming from one of the lower workings of the property at almost 100 feet depth. The rich streak is not all that is in the shoot, for, besides a large body of milling ore, there is at least ten inches of ledge material following the rich streak that is fairly alive with particles of gold. This ore is being screened and sacked for shipment and will run in the neighborhood of \$1000 to the ton.

The present development work accomplished on the Adamson-Turner property has proved it to be another wonderful mine that is rapidly getting in line with the richest in the state.

Lovejoy Paper's Write-Up.

Last week's issue of the Lovejoy Review-Miner gives an excellent write-up of the Adamson-Turner mine on Winnemucca mountain, the editor of that paper having personally inspected the property. It says:

"Probably the finest high-grade ever uncovered in the mining history of the state of Nevada is that recently unearthed in an upraise from the new tunnel on the Adamson-Turner property in the thriving young camp of Rexall, on the northwest side of Winnemucca mountain. This assertion is not made from hearsay or idle gossip, but as the result of a careful and thorough inspection of the workings of the Adamson-Turner holdings. Although this find is generally spoken of as a new strike, it is as a matter of fact but the continuation of the ore shoot that is being followed down by a winze from the upper workings, having been uncovered while making the upraise from the new tunnel at the bottom of the hill which will eventually supply air to the workings above.

"From all indications Rexall gives promise of eventually becoming one of the richest camps in the entire state; however, considerable development work is still necessary before the possibilities of the property can even remotely be estimated. Along this line it is the intention of Messrs. Adamson and Turner to install, as rapidly as possible, the required machinery for the handling of the ore. Considerable expense will be necessitated before the mine is properly worked, one large item being the fact that it will be necessary to build a pipe line, upwards of four miles in order to carry water from Winnemucca to Rexall.

"Besides the bonanza ore which is daily being extracted from the property there is mud or tale running through the rich streak which is heavily bespangled with the valuable metal and which pans a large percentage in gold. The low grade ore, also, gives promise of a heavy production of the desired metal.

"Besides the working of the Adamson-Turner company a number of leasers are prosecuting valuable development work on the property owned by the company, making finds almost daily which lead to the belief that Rexall has a brilliant future. Silver in no mean quantities is found almost touching the gold yielding property.

"Rexall already boasts a monthly payroll of about \$5000, which figure is expected to be rapidly increased as machinery is installed and actual mining commenced."

OLD JOHNNIE MINE SHOWS IMPROVEMENT

NET PROFIT OF \$10,000 MONTH ARE BEING MADE WHERE LOSSES PREVAILED.

That the Johnnie mine at Johnnie is steadily improving and justifying the confidence and energy of A. D. Myers and associate owners are bestowing upon it, is evidenced by detailed reports of operations for April and May which have just become available for publication. The improvement is not only in reduced costs in mining and milling, but also in a material increase in the average value of the ore.

The gross recovery for the two months named was over \$41,000, of which \$21,763.53 is credited to April and the balance to the month of May. The production for April was 2940 tons, total operating costs being \$19,539.65, leaving a net profit for the month of \$11,223.88. The average value per ton recovered was \$11.33, and the average value of the tailings per ton was \$1.16, the average total per ton produced being \$12.49.

An interesting feature of the report of Superintendent J. Rourke is the statement that nuggets weighing nearly an ounce were taken from the batteries, but no nuggets were found in the mine. The occurrence of the nuggets is accounted for by the fact that the vein is showing numerous seams in the quartz, giving an excellent opportunity for the precipitation of gold in nugget form.

The lower levels of the mine are showing an especially good grade of ore and large bodies of it. As the average value of all ore treated for several years has been about \$6 per ton as compared with the present average of \$11.33, the improvement in general conditions with greater depth is most gratifying.—Goldfield Tribune.

TOD EXPENSIVE FOR RENO TO ENFORCE THE LAW
