MEXICAN TELLS OF LOCATION OF MINE TO AMERICANS

WESTERN NEVADA MINING MEN HOPE TO MAKE STAKE IN CHIHUAHUA.

There has been in Gleeson for the past six or seven years a Mexican, Jesus Hernandez, who has told that he knew the location of a wonderfully rich mine in Mexico, that had been worked and abandoned many years ago. On account of having been sentenced to be shot, under the Diaz regime, Hernandez could not be induced to guide any one to the mine until the downfall of the former president. Soon after Diaz had surrendered control, Hernandez, with Bob Stone, went to the City of Chihuahua as a starting place, and from there to the mine, which he found as agreed upon, though it is in a country described as the toughest that a man could wish for and fully twenty miles from water.

Mr. Stone thoroughly sampled the workings, bringing away fourteen samples, which were assayed on their return to the United States, and none gave returns of less than \$300 to the ton, while one assayed 61 ounces in gold.

John Gleeson and Bob Stone very promptly took steps to gain possession of this property, making Hernandez an equal partner, and having now secured the mine, Gleeson and Stone departed for the City of Chihuahua, from which point they will equip an outfit and begin the preliminary work that will be necessary before active operations can be begun at the mine.

The original workings of the mine consist of a shaft that has been sunk in an irregular manner, leaving benches at intervals of about ten feet, which leads to the belief that the workers would sink the ten feet, throwing the waste and ore onto the bench above them, then onto the next and so on un-

til the surface was reached. In addition to the shaft, there are a number of burrows or gopher hole side openings, where the ore had been followed for short distances from the shaft. Not a stick of timber is to be found in the mine, nor is there any indication that there has been any timber used. Gleeson announced before his departure that it is his plan to develop the property to the fullest extent and though the country is rough and no water to be had except by hauling it, these are considerations that amount to but little where good mining property is at stake.—Courtland News.

SUGAR FACTORY NEAR FALLON IS A BUSY PLACE

MUCH MACHINERY ALREADY IN PLACE AND MORE IS ON THE ROAD.

The Nevada Sugar company's big plant is a bee hive of industry these days. Machinery is being placed in position and bricks are being placed in boiler foundations and walks. On the second floor of the main building a tremendous weight in machinery is being supported, with still more to follow. On this floor eight evaporators, weighing 15 tons each, and 10 crystallizers, 12 tons each, 10 filter presses and numerous other mechanical appliances are already in position. Much of the machinery already installed is quite adequate for a factory of 1000 tons daily capacity, although the Nevada Sugar company's plant is only planned for a 500-ton capacity. The additional machinery will be used in subsequent years when the sugar beet idea has taken firm hold of this valley, as it eventually must.

In the boiler room the 10 175-horse-power boilers are nearly ready for fires, while one adjunct not previously announced, will be installed shortly in the form of an electrical generator of 150-horse-power. This utility will manufacture the necessary light for the factory building in addition to performing other functions.

Three carloads of factory machinery are now on the road from Bay City, Mich., and will be here before that now on the ground has been put into place.

The one thing noticeable at the big plant is the number of local people who are given employment at the factory. Indeed it has been a consistent policy of the factory management to encourage in every way possible the local co-operative spirit. We do not believe that the people of this valley generally recognize the great economic benefit that comes to us from the undertaking, or of the unmeasurable good that will come from its operation upon completion.

Large sums of money have been disbursed in factory building which have passed directly through local

trade channels, with more to follow. When the factory is completed and running the Nevada Sugar company will continue to be an ever increasing agency in the disbursement of local moneys.
