## WEEK'S NEWS FROM MANHATTAN MINES

What may prove to be an important development has occurred this week in the Union No. 9 claim of the Dexter Consolidated Mining company under lease to the Manhattan War Eagle Mining and Milling company of which D. R. Finlayson is general manager.

In raising from the 235-foot level, 70 feet north of the shaft, a vertical vein was struck, at a depth of 195 feet in virgin ground that gave excellent returns from the first samples taken. The vein is from 2 1/2 to 3 feet wide, and while some very high assays are obtained its average value is from \$80 to \$100 a ton.

The new pumps for the mine are on their way and as soon as installed, exploration of the lowest levels will be continued.

The company this week milled 83 tons of ore of the value of \$26 a ton and ore is also being extracted from lease No. 14 on the same claim.

### Strike on Consolidated.

Two sets of leasers have commenced operations on the property of the Manhattan Consolidated Mines company and both leases will be good producers in the near future.

At the Musbett-Wittenberg lease a raise is being run to surface from a drift on the 65-foot level of the old Reeves incline shaft. The electric hoist now on its way to the mine will be installed here and the hoisting of ore will soon follow, as there is a three-foot vein in the old workings averaging \$40 a ton.

At the Kendall lease, the old incline shaft, 60 feet deep, is being retimbered and put in order for use as a main working shaft.

Some good ore has been encountered but its extent has not yet been proved, but the leasers are confident of developing a good producer.

### Work on Mineral Hill.

Progress on the crosscut tunnel being driven by the Mineral Hill company has been retarded to some extent during this week by the excessive hardness of the rock. The bore will reach the vein in another 15 feet, but if the same character of rock holds it will require two weeks longer to cut the quartz. To convey an idea of the unyielding nature of this particular stratum one man drilled only 32 inches in a shift and drilled 65 drills in doing it. This obstacle, however, is only a temporary incident. The vein at this point is four feet or more in width and when it is reached by the tunnel the going will be easy.

### Ten Feet of \$35 Ore.

The ore body in Bath brothers' lease on Union No. 2 claim continues to improve and in the few feet of sinking done this week has widened to over ten feet, carrying the same average value of \$32 a ton. On the east side of the shaft an intrusion of lime, which apparently cut off the ore body, has

been passed through, and the ore is apparently as strong on the east as on the west side of the shaft. Sinking is being continued on the ore, and 25 tons are piled on the dump daily and there are now about 250 tons ready for milling. The condition of the lease indicates that an immense body of ore is being opened up.

### Rich Ore on Jumping Jack.

Bris Putnam has assumed charge of the work at the Putnam-Kendall lease on the Jumping Jack and no time has been lost in starting work on the 85-foot level of the shaft. This drift was out 50 feet and is now being continued in milling ore and it is estimated that about 60 feet of drifting will be necessary before cutting the big ore shoot opened up on the surface. The last assay taken from this, across a little more than three feet of ore, gave returns of \$48.40 a ton. The fine dirt scraped up at the bottom of the shaft assayed \$112.50 a ton.

### Earl Ore Returns.

The milling of ore from the Swanson lease on the Manhattan Earl Mining company's Earl claim was commenced on Tuesday at the War Eagle mill. About 1500 tons will be milled and about 40 tons are being treated daily, the average returns being about \$25 a ton. At the lease the main shaft is now

being timbered to the 250-foot level, a new pump will be installed and production of ore from the 100, 200 and 250 levels will be resumed.

### White Caps Plant.

The new surface equipment at the White Caps lease is now in running order with the exception of the sinking pump, and while this is being installed the small quantity of water now in the shaft will be hoisted with a bucket. A careful sampling of the ore in the bottom of the mine shows values are well maintained, in the east drift there being three feet of ore assaying over \$100 per ton.

### Big Pine Lease.

The origin of the gold struck last week on the Kelley lease on the Big Pine has been located, two very rich stringers having been found in the shaft. These are dipping to the quartzite footwall and are now being followed in the belief that they are leaders to a good ore shoot. The lease will henceforth be known as the Butchers' lease, that being the business of those interested in it.

### Union No. 4 Lease.

The ore body at the Ferguson-Gillan-Plourd lease on Union No. 4 claim continues to improve with development and promises to be the star producer of high grade ore in the camp. The leasers have now purchased a hoist and as soon as installed the shaft will be sunk another 50 feet and the ore shoot opened up for stoping.

### Mayflower Milling Ore.

The McNeill mill is now running on a trial lot of ore from the Ray

lease on the Mayflower. This will probably amount to about 50 tons, and is being milled by the leasers to give a correct idea of the mill value of their ore body. In the McNeill lease ore is being blocked out for stoping and milling will commence in a few days.

### OLD UNIONVILLE MINE WILL AGAIN PRODUCE

The new mill, lately built up at the Arizona mine, has been put in operation, and promises to bring that old mine back to the production of former years, if not to greater production, says the Lovelock Tribune. There used to be 30 stamps dropping in the old mills at the mouth of the canyon, and the town was formerly the county seat of this county. There were 3000 people living in the camp in its most prosperous days. It may not again reach to those heights of activity, but that it is destined to yet make a record of production is quite certain.

After being milled the ores were formerly run through amalgamating pans, now they will be treated with the cyanide process, and every available method used to save the values, which are chiefly in silver. Parties have lately been thoroughly sampling the tailings from the old mills, and find that these may be treated under the new processes and good values taken therefrom. Options have been taken on these tailings and preparations are now under way to put in the equipment necessary to treat them.
