



Island of Soap Saves Marie and Her Crew

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 2.—Captain Pedro Balducci yesterday saved the good scow Marie from the rocks of the Farrallones and made enough on the trip to more than pay for the repairs of his vessel, not counting incidental expenses. He also had one of the most thrilling experiences in the history of San Francisco bay or the vicinity.

The captain's sudden good luck was due partly to chance. Following the loss of his vessel Monday, Captain Pedro at once prepared a salvage ship to save his craft. After working on the Marie all last night he succeeded in floating her at high tide and started to sail back to this city. When midway between the Farrallones and the Golden Gate, the Marie started leaking and threatened to sink. Everything on board at once was dumped over the side.

In the bottom of the Marie was half a ton of chloride of lime, used for disinfecting fish. There was also a barrel of oil and also a keg of lye with which the decks were scrubbed.

When the lime, the lye and the

oil were dumped overboard together, Captain Pedro was surprised to see a flakey white substance form. The churning of the sea mixed the ingredients and the water, acting as a flux, quickly made soap. The cake of soap grew and grew as the barrel of oil and the lime blended, and while the doughty skipper looked on with his one eye, he saw a small soap island created.

With his usual quick thought he realized that here was a chance to save not only the lives of all on board, including the parrot, but to save the Marie itself. He at once leaped upon the soap island, and by means of tackles managed to haul the sinking craft on the great cake of soap. In a short time the repairs to the Marie were made, and the vessel was launched again.

Captain Pedro attached a line to the soap island and towed it to Fisherman's wharf, where he immediately sold it for a sum which leaves him a snug balance after all expenses connected with the repair of the Marie are paid. Joy now reigns on Fisherman's wharf.

GOVERNOR OF OREGON IS A POOR SHOT

Oregon's governor went out deer hunting a short time ago but neglected to supply himself with a hunting license. A game warden was in the party and told the executive of the state that if he fired a shot without a license it would mean the dark cold dungeon for him, so the governor postponed his hunting trip. A farmer had a pet deer and knowing what kind of a shot the governor was, tied the deer to a tree. The governor took careful aim and clipped a branch three feet above the head of the deer. The farmer would not let him shoot again for fear some of the falling branches might injure the pet.
