STATE MEDICAL ASSOCIATION WILL ASSEMBLE

Arrangements have been perfected for the eighth annual meeting of the Nevada State Medical association which will convene in Reno on October 10th, 11th and 12th. The meeting place has been designated as the Commercial Club rooms, which have been donated for that purpose. Last year the association held their annual gathering at Lake Tahoe. Delegates from all parts of the state will be present and many interesting lectures will be delivered. In addition to Nevada speakers, a number of prominent California physicians will also be present, as will also a Salt Lake and New York representative.

TERRIBLE INJURIES RESULT IN DEATH

Skipper James Whalen, who was frightfully mangled in the Johnnie mine last week, died at Las Vegas hospital last Sunday night, after a most remarkable battle with death.

Nearly every bone in the trunk of Whalen's body was broken and he was completely paralyzed. Notwithstanding his terrible condition he survived the rough trip from the mine to Las Vegas and lived for five days. The doctors claim he would have continued permanently paralyzed had he survived his injuries.

PUBLICITY.

Publicity for the legitimate corporation spells prosperity in my opinion. By publicity I mean that business corporations should not conceal the records of their transactions, but should make them public and should at all times deal fairly and frankly with their stockholders and the public in general. In the last few years the American public has lost many millions of dollars through swindling operations in imaginary enterprises, bucket-shops and get-rich-quick schemes generally, prompted by alluring advertisements and circulars. If the investors had had opportunity to know the real financial condition of these companies and their business methods their savings would not have been lost. Instead their money would have been put into legitimate business corporations.—Attorney General Wickersham.
