

BOOKS SHOW DISCREPANCIES OF SCHEFFTELS

NEW YORK, Oct. 31.—At the continuation of the Scheffels trial, the government showed discrepancies in cash books and brokers' records. From a bookkeeper the prosecution brought out the purchase of blocks of Rawhide Coalition at 50 cents a share from the Scheeline Trust company, and blocks of Ely Central from O. A. Turner at the same price. The witness testified that Scheffels had to keep open nights to fill orders before the raid. Counsel wrangled all day over the identification of books.

OPENS UP A GOOD ORE BODY

In a section well mineralized, lying about seven miles north of Tonopah on a property known as the "Tonopah Garden City," active development work has been carried on for several months past. A well timbered shaft has been sunk 100 feet and a drift run forty feet through the country rock, which opens up a well-defined ledge four feet in width, which carries gold values in gold, silver, lead and copper clear across its face.

The vein, found in an andesite formation, though narrow on top, can be traced for 1700 feet upon the surface, and gradually widens and grows stronger with depth and gives every indication of developing into an immense ore body with sinking, showing remarkably strong even at the 100-foot level.

There is a 15-horse-power gasoline hoist upon the property and a pump to handle water, which is already quite a factor to be taken care of.

The property is owned and operated by local people, well-known in this community who are confident they will develop a mine that will be a big producer before very long.

MEXICAN LEADER BELIEVES REVOLT WILL SPREAD

SAN ANTONIO, Texas, Oct. 31.—The revolt in the state of Tabasco, Mexico, will spread, according to General Bernardino Reyes, Reyes declared he had no hand in the outbreak, but said:

"It is the result of discontent created by a lack of liberty in the recent election, which the candidacy of Madero imposed upon the people by the authorities. I believe disturbances will occur elsewhere in the republic."

General Reyes said friends in Mexico advise him that affairs are becoming serious there.
