## WINGFIELD BUYS JARBIDGE MINE

REPORTED DEAL IS MADE FOR THE FAMOUS BLUSTER PROPERTY.

It is stated on good authority that at a conference held Wednesday at Ogden between Ed Banane, one of the owners of the Bluster property of the Jarbidge district, and George Wingfield, president of the Goldfield Consolidated Mines company, a deal was consummated by which Mr. Wingfield secures the control of this property on the basis of \$750,000 for the whole. The deal, therefore, involves practically \$500,000, says the Salt Lake Tribune.

Mr. Wingfield is operating the Success property at Jarbidge, which adjoins the Bluster, and the latest reports have it that he has drifted to within twenty feet of the Bluster lines on excellent gold ore, demonstrating that the Success resources are to extend into the Bluster, making the latter well worth the price stipulated.

This is one of the largest deals in the history of Jarbidge, and it is without question the most important, as Mr. Wingfield undoubtedly has a great respect for the camp since beginning his Success property operations. The deal promises to attract public attention as nothing else could, and the property owners there should find capital more willing from now on to venture in that field.

All who are familiar with Jarbidge and who have given Mr. Wingfield's operations there careful study, believe that he is working along the lines of a big consolidation, and they are certain a merger will be effected of a number of Jarbidge companies within the next few months. Conditions at the camp are at their best so far, and everything points to this being one of the most active as well as attractive spots in Nevada gold mining during 1912.

RICHARD HENNESSY DIES FROM PNEUMONIA

After an illness of four days with pneumonia, Richard Hennessy, a

resident of this section, passed to the Great Beyond. A week ago the deceased became ill at the dry farm, about six miles below Tonopah, where he and his associates have been experimenting for the past two years in dry farming a section of land, and after two days' illness came to Tonopah and shortly afterward pneumonia developed. The deceased was of a quiet disposition and had many friends hereabout who will learn with sorrow of his demise. At the time of his death he was in his 50th year of life.

Richard Williams, lineman with the Western Union Telegraph company in this city, is a cousin of the deceased. The remains will be shipped to Van Buren, Arkansas, where a brother resides.

## WORK BEING PUSHED ON THE TONOPAH "76"

Considerable activity is manifest at the present time on the property of the Tonopah "76" company, where a force of several men is busy sinking shafts on three of the claims for patent requirements. As soon as this work is completed sinking on the "76" claim will begin for the main working shaft and this will be carried down to a depth of several hundred feet without cessation of labor. In addition to this the shaft now being sunk at the Sago Fraction will be continued to an indefinite depth. The work now proceeding at this shaft is passing through a heavily mineralized formation and indicates some values, though as yet no assays have been made.

### CHICAGO PACKERS OFFER PLEAS OF NOT GUILTY

CHICAGO, Dec. 7.—All packers who were indicted for violation of the anti-trust law appeared in the United States district court when the case was called yesterday, and pleas of not guilty were entered. The extreme penalty for conviction is a fine of \$500 or one year in jail, or both.
