OFFICIAL VOTE OF CALIFORNIA IS ANNOUNCED

STATE STATISTICIAN GIVES FIGURES IN PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARIES

SACRAMENTO, Cal., June 12.—The official vote of the presidential primary just tabulated by Statistician James M. Cremin of Secretary of State Jordan's office, gives the following figures:

For president—Roosevelt 138,653; Taft, 69,345; La Follette, 45,876. Democratic ticket—Wilson, 17,214; Clark, 43,163.

Delegates at large, Roosevelt ticket: Hiram Johnson, 156,302; Chester Rowell, 154,693; Meyer Lissner, 155,392; Francis J. Heney, 155,582. Taft Ticket—Abbie E. Krebs, 79,270; Ella L. Westland, 79,200; W. A. Foster, 79,433; W. C. Patterson, 79,328, La Follette ticket—William E Smythe, 74,805; F. E. Porter, 54,120; Ira L. Miller, 73,938; Joseph Kahn, 53,930.

Democratic delegates at large—Wilson ticket: A. Caminetti, 20,165; James D. Phelan, 20,199; George S. Patton, 20,108; Timothy Spellacy, 20,157. Clark ticket—Theodore A. Bell, 51,867; A. L. Stephens, 51,505; James V. Coleman, 51,569; Charles A. Barlow, 51,510.

NO PROGRESS MADE AGAINST THE I. W. W.

SAN DIEGO, June 12.—"San Diego today has arrived at where it was when the trouble started."

This statement, made by First Assistant Attorney General Raymond Benjamin, is generally accepted as accurately descriptive of the so-called free-speech fight here. A number of meetings were held Sunday and Monday outside the restricted district, without molestation. It is expected that a test case for free speech inside the restricted district will soon be forced into the courts.

CALIFORNIA HAS INCREASED ASSESSMENT

SACRAMENTO, Cal., June 12.—An increase of nearly \$500,000 over last year is shown today in the assessment roll of corporation taxes for state purposes. The roll as finished by the state board of equalization totals \$10,000,000.

About \$250,000 more money will be required to run the state this year than last, but will be taken care of easily by the corporations and inheritance taxes and other general receipts, so that the only state tax which counties will have to pay will be the Panama exposition levy.
