THE RESPONSE OF JUSTICE.

Less than a month ago John Gregovich, a highly respected citizen of this city, was stabbed to death. Yesterday afternoon his slayer was adjudged guilty of the crime of murder in the first degree and sentenced to pay the death penalty. During the interim the defendant was given a preliminary examination, his case was investigated by the grand jury and he was afforded every right in both instances. He was given a fair and impartial trial before a jury of his peers, a jury of unbiased and unprejudiced men. The verdict was death in the fulfillment of that old Mosaic law demanding "an eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth."

Justice has been meted out in a remarkably short space of time, as far as the court of Nye county is concerned. The many delays that occur in the trial of an ordinary case were strangely absent in the hearing of the murderer. The technicalities of the law, understood only by the attorneys, and deplored by the public, were not resorted to, or if attempts were made to secure delays, they were promptly overruled by the bench.

A new era has resulted in the trial of criminal cases in the district court of Nye county and now all that remains of the fulfillment of justice is similar prompt action by the supreme court, should the case be carried to that tribunal for final determination. The people of Nye county have expressed their opinion in the matter. The expression has been in calm, deliberate terms, not in the heat of passion, and should be final.

The vigilantes of San Diego threaten to form a new state and cut loose from California owing to the interference of Governor Hiram Johnson, who declared himself somewhat in favor of the Industrial Workers of the World. The vigilantes are not to be blamed, but first they should get rid of the disturbing element in order to live happily ever afterwards. Tonopah and Goldfield once had a little experience with the dishwashers that dictated the policy of that organization, and the people of the southern part of Nevada are thorough in sympathy with San Diego and her citizens.

Boomer clubs are arriving in Chicago to sound the praises of their particular candidates for the presidential nomination. Several years ago Nevada could have formed a boomer club that would be able to give the new organizations lessons in every way imaginable. However, the days of the boomers in Nevada are past and this state will not be represented in that capacity at the republican and democratic conventions.

It is one thing to "rope and hog-tie" a delegation from a state dominated by a political machine powerful enough to ignore the laws within the sphere of its immediate influence, and another thing to deliver it in a national convention in defiance of the laws of that body. Hiram Johnson has discovered this fact, and his wails of woe would be pitiful if it were not so funny.

Some of the ape-beasts which Roosevelt shot in Africa, according to report, were wont to beat their breasts, gnash their great teeth and emit hideous, roaring sounds when cornered. The weird howls of rage emanating from Oyster Bay these days would seem to indicate that the colonel did learn something in Africa after all.

Another pseudo foreign nobleman appears to have victimized an American girl of wealth, and a marriage was near to being consummated when the police gathered him in. On the whole, these fakes seem little worse, and less costly, than some of the genuine "noblemen" in which American millions have been invested.

BULLION BARS FROM MANHATTAN ARE SHIPPED

SMALL FORTUNE ARRIVES IN
TONOPAH FROM THE WAR
EAGLE MILL.

Bullion valued at \$3000 was conveyed to Tonopah yesterday afternoon from Manhattan by one of the Consolidated Auto company machines, and stored in the vaults of a local bank. The treasure, representing a cleanup of the War Eagle mill, was entrusted to the care of "Shorty" Kutzkau for transportation across the desert.

In addition to the bullion 10 sacks of concentrates were included in the shipment and were deposited with the Wells Fargo company for transportation to the smelters. The concentrates, which weighed 600 pounds, are believed to have a value far in excess to the bullion, although no figures could be secured.
