**A Hard Earned Victory**

One week ago today, Monday, the plant of the Tonopah Daily Bonanza, in conjunction with several other costly buildings, was totally destroyed by fire. Today, seven days after the big conflagration, this paper is issued on its own plant. The copy is written in the new and costly Bonanza offices; the type is set on the Bonanza's linotype machine, the forms are made up in the job printing department, and the papers are run off in the Bonanza's press rooms.

Seven days in which to rehabilitate a daily newspaper, and to do a gigantic task, is an undertaking of considerable magnitude, and is worthy of mention. It has not been the result of the labors of one man, but is the total of work performed by every member of the Bonanza force. This force has labored night and day and every piece of work has been carried out systematically. There has been no rest for the force and no rest was demanded, except a few minutes occasionally for meals.

Last Monday morning, and here a little ancient history is quoted, to better exemplify the spirit that is to be observed about the Bonanza plant, while a survey was being taken of the ruins that marked what was once the newspaper plant, one of the employees was informed by the management that pay days would, apparently, be few and far between during the next few months.

"To hell with the pay days," was the response. "Where is a shovel," and he immediately started has resulted in the Bonanza being a spirit as that just mentioned that it resulted in the Bonanza being printed today on its own plant, and it is that self same spirit that will make the Bonanza a bigger and better paper as soon as the rough edges are worn off the newly improvised quarters.

The management of the Bonanza has been the recipient of many congratulations, especially since the issuing of a paper Monday within 12 hours after the fire. While the well wishes have been appreciated, it is but right that credit should be given the Bonanza force for the excellent showing made. Without such a force—well, the Bonanza would not be issuing today.
