CANOLE WINS IN EIGHTH FROM DELL ON FOUL

Willie Canole, the San Francisco lightweight, won from Harry Dell last night at the end of the eighth round of a scheduled 20-round bout. Dell lost the match on a foul.

The fight, which was staged at the Nevada theater under the management of Promoter Jake Goodfriend, was good while it lasted, but the ending served to wipe the good spots from the memory of the spectators. The house was well filled, many fight fans having journeyed over from Goldfield to witness the contest.

In the seventh round Dell deliberately quit fighting, and holding up his hand, declared that Canole had fouled him. Referee Charlie Perry of Goldfield declared a vacation for the fighters, an unusual proceeding and summoned Drs. proceeding, and summoned Drs. where an examination was made of Dell. The physicians announced that no foul had been committed, and the eighth round of the fight was resumed. Canole was on the ropes and was landing blows frequently when suddenly the referee crowded between the boys and declared Canole the winner of the bout. It was observed clearly by the spectators that Dell clearly and deliberately fouled Canole two times.

Throughout the fight Canole was fighting like a demon and appeared to have Dell at his mercy. He appeared to a better advantage than on the Fourth of July when he boxed Harry Ryan a 20-round draw.
