**WHITTENBERG AND
MUSHETT LEASE
GOOD SHOWING**

LEDGE TWENTY FEET IN WIDTH
IS OPENED UP IN MANHAT-
TAN PROPERTY

MANHATTAN, July 24. — The
foot wall in the Mushett-Whitten-
berg lease, at the 130-foot level
where a very large ore body re-
cently was developed, has been tapped
and the measurement of the
ledge is 20 feet. It at once takes
its place as one of the very large
ore bodies of the camp and is on
the bills for a big production, once
it is sufficiently opened and stop-
ping shall commence.

As yet the grade is low for that
lease, but samplings indicate a
really fair milling value. They
have run thus far from \$18 to \$36
a ton. Considering the hugeness
of the deposit it can be the for-
mer rather than the latter figure
and place the leasers on easy
street.

But when stopping is under way
if not in otherwise crosscutting
the ledge, L. L. Mushett expects
it to divulge a rich pay shoot sim-
ilar to the former one that created
a great flurry in Manhattan secu-
