Lawlessness in New York

New York has a "murder car" that should figure in a Camorra drama. The idea is borrowed from the operations of a recently eliminated gang which operated in the center of Paris with a regular shooting up of the old town which would have done credit to Cedar Shingles, Montana, when that town was the objective point of the cow country and every citizen went about his daily toil with a complete arsenal dangling from various parts of his anatomy. The only difference is that in the east they believe in refining crime to such an extent that assassination is raised to the dignity of a fine art and the homicidal mania is treated more as a acute mental disorder rather than a criminal impulse. STRAY LEDGE IN MANHATTAN CON- LEASE IS RICH

HIGH GRADE VALUES ARE UNCOVERED AND LEDGE WILL BE STOPPED FOR ORE

MANHATTAN, July 29.—Things went asthmatically during the past week when the word was passed quietly around that a strike of high grade had been made on the 250 or lowest level of the Mudgett-Wittenberg lease on the Manhattan Consolidated. And it proved to be true in detail. A strike has been made there that promises the biggest things. It is a high-grade ore shoot that assays without selection of ore, except to throw out the lime that always get mixed in, \$96 a ton, and this for some five feet between the hanging and what is believed but not proven to be the foot. Another assay for a foot or two greater width and not a particle of the lime thrown out went \$17.

What is more the ore is free milling and pans high. It may carry some base but does not appear to. But the remarkable circumstance about the strike is that the ledge appears to be a strag. The 155 feet of work that has been done on the level was for the purpose of catching high-grade shoot struck three months ago on the 130 level which made a big boom at the time. But there is hardly a particle of resemblance, yet both are good enough. The new one, in fact, appears more like one that was encountered close to the shaft at the 130 yet even that seems incredible, for to be the same it would have to lie so flat that it would be almost inconceivable for the two to pitch from the one point to the other and be identical. There is no such flat pitch at either point of opening, but their characteristics are much alike.

This strike was made almost wholly by accident. Recently at a fault there was a big cave-in in the crosscut on the 250 which had to be bulkheaded and the tunnel run in a meandering course to the north and west to get around the bad country. In doing this another fault plane was intersected and ascertained to be running in the direction for which the crosscut was being run. Accordingly the crack was followed and it has opened into this shoot of high grade. The ore was struck from the hanging wall side and on the foot there is some lime which may not be the real wall. In two places the ore seems to make into it, thereby raising a farther doubt.

The present plan is to continue driving through this shoot in the hope of running into the sensational rich one that three months ago on the 130 made this lease and the Consolidated mine famous. To drift through that and tap the still larger one of a milling grade that was subsequently struck on the upper level, which is so large that there are no walls closer together
