TONOPAH & GOLDFIELD RAILROAD SUSTAINS SMALL DAMAGE YESTERDAY

The rainstorm of yesterday afternoon extended over a wide area, according to reports that reached Tonopah this morning. The Tonopah & Goldfield railroad suffered a small amount of damage while the Southern Pacific was less fortunate. The local company's road was slightly damaged near the main line junction, when the track was washed away. The damage was repaired last night and the trains traveled on schedule time this morning.

The Southern Pacific track was washed away at some point between Sodaville and Laws, but the extent of the damage could not be learned. It is believed, however, that the damage did not equal that occasioned by the heavy rain storm of two weeks ago.

CONVICTS CAUGHT AFTER ESCAPING FROM ROAD GANG

CAUGHT JUST BEFORE THEY WERE LEAVING BORDER LINE NEAR OREGON

Covered with dirt, sun burned and tired, Sheriff C. P. Ferrel arrived in Reno from Gerlach about 1:15 this afternoon bringing convicts Calvert and Williams with him, having captured them at ranches north of Gerlach, where they had sought food and rest on their way north.

Sheriff Ferrel was in Gerlach Sunday afternoon talking to Billy Murdock when Judge Norton approached and began to question Murdock about a strange man Murdock had seen the night before. The sheriff became interested and from the description of the horse came to the conclusion that the man Murdock had seen riding from the mountains into the desert was Williams.

The sheriff immediately secured a rig and accompanied by Al Schell, his deputy and John Raser, went to Granite Mountain Sunday night. There he was told that the convict had gone to the Fly ranch and on entering the house found Calvert eating supper. The sheriff left Calvert in the custody of a deputy to take to Gerlach and went to Cane Springs, arriving there about 2 o'clock Monday morning. There after a short search he found Williams sleeping in a manger and the horse standing near.

The men were tired but they made a hard fight for their liberty and both were intended to leave next morning for the Oregon line. They were both seen, a much-angled one and no, indeed, and would have been able to travel fast the next day.—Reno Gazette.
