True Welcher Antics

Less than two months ago the republican national convention met at Chicago. There three candidates presented their claims to the party nomination for the presidency. William Howard Taft received the nomination. Colonel Roosevelt and Senator La Follette were consequently defeated. La Follette, on being defeated, submitted with good grace. Colonel Roosevelt acted to the contrary, and has been howling like a spoiled baby who has lost his candy ever since.

The people of Nevada have but little use for a poor loser. In local terms a person of that sort is usually referred to as a welcher or a piker. The term appears to be perfectly applicable in Roosevelt's case, and has been frequently applied since the Chicago convention. In his every act the doughty colonel has made himself appear as an injured person. He has posed as an example of injured innocence, having been martyred for the cause.

The east may look with favor upon a person of the Roosevelt ilk, but in the west it is different. The westerner believes in applauding a man who shows himself a game loser, but the poor loser is never extended sympathy. It is in this light that the western public views the antics of Roosevelt.

Upsetting the Traditions

The manner in which Senator W. A. Massey is applying himself to his new duties at Washington has resulted in words of praise from all sources for the junior Nevada senator. Senator Massey is to be found in his office from the early hours of the morning until the late hours of night and he is constantly employed throughout that time. He is not living in Washington and holding down the situation for the social prestige that may result, as happens to be the case of the majority of senators who now grace the halls of congress.

Of the entire senatorial assemblage at Washington it will prove a difficult manner to select more than a dozen members who are to be classed among the real workers of the body. Of this number Senator Massey is to be included and before his brief term expires it can be assured that he will rank among the leaders. Heretofore custom has demanded that a senator serve several years before he is allowed the liberty of delivering an address or to take an active part in the proceedings. Senator Massey has managed to completely upset this custom and is making his presence felt before occupying the office a month.

When the call of the bull moose was sounded Roosevelt answered. When the call of the American voters is heard in November William Howard Taft will answer.

The people of Tonopah have nothing for which they can thank Roosevelt, unless it is the panic that caused the closing of the doors of two banking institutions in this city.
