JUDGE LINDSEY HEARS FROM CHIEF BULL MOOSE

DENVER, Colo., August 21.—Judge Ben B. Lindsey of the juvenile court here has received a letter from Theodore Roosevelt in which the progressive leader indorses the action taken by the third party leaders in Colorado in placing a new set of candidates in the field, outside of the republican party.

"It seems to me clear that the course of events in Colorado has made it necessary for the progressives to nominate their own ticket, disregarding the republican primaries," the letter says.

"In every state we recognize the man who sent the delegation to the Chicago progressive convention and in Colorado I feel very strongly that the fight must be clean-cut against both the old party machines."

TONOPAH SEES BRIGHT FUTURE SAYS GAZETTE

With the price of white metal up and with the camp of Tonopah producing more silver than ever before in its history, the people of that district are jubilant. The price of the white metal has been going up recently and with its advance the production of silver at Tonopah has also increased and with more properties opening up it is estimated the camp will be increased by several hundred people within a short time, says the Gazette.

Tonopah has suffered from two severe fires recently, but despite this the people are not discouraged, as new and better buildings will rise from the ashes of the old and with the camp producing steadily it looks as if there is a greater future in store for the southern mining city. The advance in the price of silver this month causes the output of the camp to increase in value more than \$10,000.
