Where Credit Is Due

During the past two months, or, to be specific, since the disastrous fire of July 7, the work of insuring the Bonanza has necessitated long hours of labor for all concerned. On many different occasions it has been found necessary to secure assistance from the various business men of Tonopah. In this particular we believe it no more than just that due thanks be extended F. H. Bruce, local manager of the Nevada-California Power company.

When the work of rehabilitating the Bonanza plant was first started, the service of Mr. Bruce and his assistants were constantly in demand and on each occasion it was only necessary to ask, and the favors would be granted. More than once a request was made for electrical connections after nightfall, when power or lights were needed. There was no hesitancy on the part of Mr. Bruce, and not waiting to secure the services of one of his employes, he always answered instantly and personally furnished what was desired.

No later than yesterday considerable trouble was experienced in making a refractory motor run smoothly. Mr. Bruce took charge of the work and labored all afternoon until 8 o'clock last night, before the trouble was conquered and the machinery operated smoothly. It is such instances as these mentioned that has made the publication of the Bonanza possible, and it appears no more than right that credit be given where credit is due.

The Nevada-California Power company in fortunate in having a person of Mr. Bruce's calibre at the head of its Tonopah office.

A Silent Candidate

Woodrow Wilson, the so-called standard bearer of the democratic party, appears to be attempting the difficult feat of carrying water on both shoulders. In announcing his plans for the coming campaign, it was stated that very few speeches were to be delivered by the democratic candidate. If Wilson has the courage of his convictions he has failed as yet to express himself, and indications point to continued silence on the part of the former college president.

A principle is not worth fighting for in Reno. The divorce followers in the riverside city placed a lawyer in nomination for the state senate. The lawyer favors a continuation of the present divorce law. No opposition was made in the republican ranks of that county for it was feared that an anti-divorce candidate would not be elected. All of which speaks largely for the calibre of the Renosites.

Petitions are being circulated in California asking for the recall of Governor Hiram Johnson from office. It is evident that the voters of that state do not relish the idea of paying a salary to an executive who spends the majority of his time campaigning in the east.

OPEN BONANZA IN HANGING WALL OF BIG FOUR

GLORY HOLE BELIEVED TO HAVE
BEEN WORKED OUT SHOWS
RICHES

MANHATTAN, AUGUST 28. — The Big Four has opened a bonanza in the hanging wall of the glory hole that was supposed to have been worked out under the Steen-Poak-Cicala lease. Superintendent E. C. Maguire knew of the ore here and has shot into it for ten feet, with all ore in the face. An assay Thursday gave a result of \$2064.20 a ton. This result was not surprising for the material was the same as the richest in the ore body and looked perfectly natural. It was a hard spur coated over with a yellow oxidized matter that pans tremendous values.

This strike means the addition of a huge tonnage to the reserves of the Big Four and it will be drawn upon in due time when required.

On the 500-foot level a raise is being put up to the 400 on an ore body that is the raise is from four to five feet wide and averages \$15 a ton. This is from the west drift and crosses off the main southeast tunnel and is 120 feet across country from the shaft.
